President's Letter by Aaron Mullens

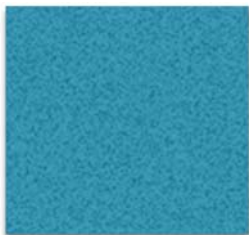

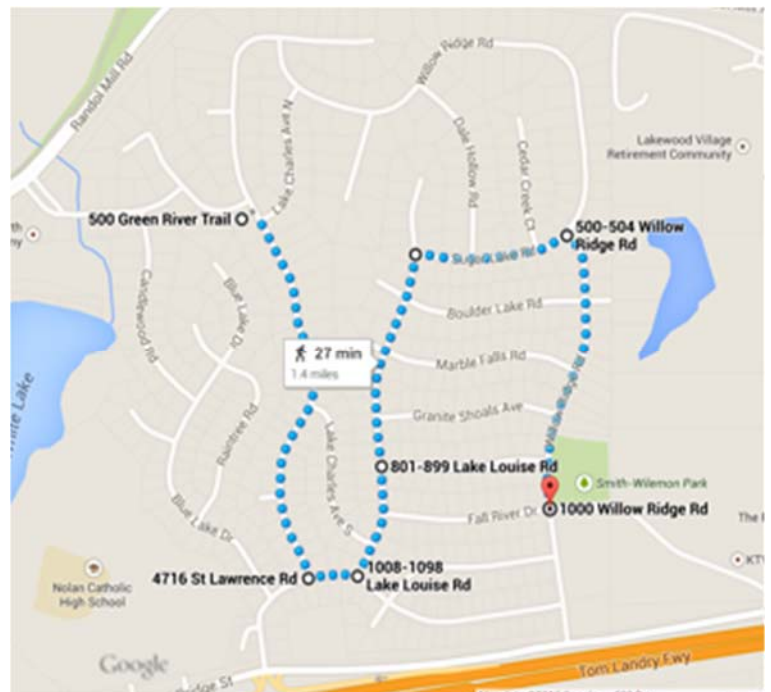


Jack White Memorial July 4th Parade and Picnic

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2015 Crime Report by Mike Brooks

We've had a total of six crime incidents reported so far this year. One incident was an unsuccessful attempt to break-in and another resulted in the quick capture of theft suspects. As summer approaches, make sure doors/windows (especially garage doors) are down and locked. If you park vehicles in your driveway or in the street, remove all valuables from the unit interior and lock them in the trunk or in your home. Don't give the bad guys an opportunity to make you or your neighbor a victim.

Jan 1 Burglary (through open garage door) – Chandler Lake
Feb 1 Breaking & Entering/Burglary (vacant residence) – Saint Lawrence
Mar 1 Theft (mail - suspects apprehended thanks to alert Willow Ridge resident)
1 Criminal Mischief (attempt to break-in residence unsuccessful) – Blue Lake
Apr 1 Theft (air compressor) from pick-up truck bed – Willow Ridge
