Credit Discrimination

It is illegal to:

- Refuse you credit if you qualify for it
- **Discourage you from** applying for credit
- Offer you credit on terms that are less favorable, like a higher interest rate, than terms offered to someone with similar

qualifications

Close your account

On the basis of:

- Race or color Religion
- •
- National origin
- Sex or marital status Age (as long as you are old enough to enter into a contract)
- **Receipt of income** from any public as-

sistance program **Exercising in good** faith your rights under the Consumer **Credit Protection Act**
