#### **Partnerships: Communities and the Phoenix** Neighborhood Patrol

Phoenix Neighborhood Patrol has long supported the notion that involved residents are the most effective crime fighters, reporting suspicious activity as it occurs. This program allows residents to become more actively involved as partners in crime prevention. They are the Phoenix Police Department's "Eyes and Ears!"

The Phoenix Neighborhood Patrol Program began in 1994 as Block Watchers On Patrol and was associated with the Block Watch McGruff logo.

In 2009 members logged over 53,000 miles and volunteered over 25,000 hours of their time to their neighborhood! That is over \$527,000 in value to the community.

Crime prevention is every citizen's responsibility. Some communities in Phoenix already have conducted citizen patrols with success. Providing these patrols often gives people a stronger sense of ownership in their neighborhood, as well as drawing neighbors together in a common cause.

The citizen patrols can be conducted on an 'as available' basis and are by no means mandatory. The Phoenix Police Department will provide the training and tools to volunteers who would like to become more involved in crime prevention around their neighborhoods.

There are 4 hours of training in the areas of patrol procedures, observation skills, the 9-1-1 system, reporting techniques, confrontation avoidance, safety practices and Block Watch grants. Citizens who complete the training will be provided program identification cards, authorized to use identifying automobile door placards and cellular telephone equipment to conduct crime prevention activities in their neighborhood and to record and report suspicious activity.

# Valenzuela Applauds Approval of SAFER, TIGER Funding

"Public safety has been, and will always be, my top priority and we continue to search out every additional dollar available to strengthen our efforts. Yesterday's Phoenix City Council vote to apply for \$7.4 million in federal SAFER grant funds moves us closer to completing another big piece of our strategic safety plan to ensure the health and well-being of our residents. Since taking office in 2012, I have made it a priority to show up in Washington, D.C. again and again to advocate for our city's fair share of federal funds to hire more police officers and firefighters. During the economic downturn, the millions in federal funds that we successfully advocated for and received represented the best option to continue fortifying our first responder teams. This year's budget once again made the hiring of officers and firefighters a priority. However, federal funds remain essential to continue moving in the right direction, making our Police and Fire departments whole once again. These SAFER grant funds will allow for the hiring of an additional 43 firefighters, for two years, to ensure the continued safety of our neighborhoods, covering all salary and benefit costs.

May 27th's council vote to apply for up to \$10 million in Transportation Investment Generating Economic Recovery (TIGER) grants represents another creative way to ensure the health and safety of our neighborhoods, and much more.

The TIGER funds will bring to life the Grand Canalscape vision, stretching from the East Valley to West Phoenix, including the addition of canal trails, safety lighting, bridges and signaled street crossings for bicyclists and pedestrians. Health and safety go hand in hand and activating dormant land surrounding our canals will encourage healthy outdoor exercise and recreation while discouraging criminal activities. These TIGER funds will create social, economic and transit related connections throughout our city and beyond. This is the future of comprehensive public safety."


#### Transportation Tax Election Scheduled For August 25, 2015

Phoenix voters will decide whether to increase the sales tax dedicated to transportation from four to seven cents per ten dollars to improve neighborhood and major streets, grow bus routes and increase service, and triple the Phoenix light rail system. The 35 year tax would start in 2016. If passed, the city will reallocate \$16 million from the city's general fund for initially hiring 125 more police officers.

# DID YOU KNOW?

# THESE SIX POPULAR FOODS CAN ADD HIGH LEVELS OF SODIUM TO YOUR DIET'

The American Heart Association recommends that you aim to eat less than 1,500 mg of sodium per day.



When you see the Heart-Check mark on a product, you know the food has been certified to meet nutritional criteria for heart-healthy foods, including sodium.



# **BREADS & ROLLS**

Some foods that you eat several times a day, such as bread, add up to a lot of sodium even though each serving may not seem high in sodium. Check the labels to find lower-sodium varieties.



# COLD CUTS & CURED MEATS

One 2 oz. serving, or 6 thin slices, of deli meat can contain as much as half of your daily recommended dietary sodium. Look for lowersodium varieties of your favorite lunch meats.



## PIZZA

A slice of pizza with several toppings can contain more than half of your daily recommended dietary sodium. Limit the cheese and add more veggies to your next slice.





## **POULTRY**

Sodium levels in poultry can vary based on preparation methods. You will find a wide range of sodium in poultry products, so it is important to choose wisely.





### SOUP

Sodium in one cup of canned soup can range from 100 to as much as 940 milligrams—more than half of your daily recommended intake. Check the labels to find lower sodium varieties.





### **SANDWICHES**

A sandwich or burger from a fast food restaurant can contain more than 100 percent of your daily suggested dietary sodium. Try half a sandwich with a side salad instead.



# EARLY VOTING INFORMATION PHOENIX CITY COUNCIL ELECTION

The City of Phoenix will hold the regularly scheduled Mayor and Council Election on Tuesday, **Aug. 25**, **2015**. In this election, registered voters who reside in the city of Phoenix will elect a Mayor. Also, voters residing in City Council District 1, 3, 5, and 7 will elect Council Members.

There is no election for council member in Council Districts 2, 4, 6, and 8 this year because the terms of the council members are staggered.

Phoenix voters can vote early either by mail or at an early voting location.

#### **Permanent Early Voting List**

Arizona law allows voters to place their name on a Permanent Early Voting List, which is maintained by the County Recorder. Once you are on this list, you do not have to request that an early ballot be mailed to you for each election. Instead, by being on this list, an early ballot will be mailed to you approximately 26 days prior to the election. #### Requests for an Early Ballot by Mail

Registered voters who are not on the Permanent Early Voting List, but wish to receive an early ballot by mail, may request a ballot. Request forms are available by clicking on the link below. Request forms can also be obtained by calling the City Clerk Department, Records and Elections Division, at the phone number listed below. The City Clerk must receive a signed, written request for an early ballot by mail no later than 5 p.m. Friday, Aug. 14.

#### **Mailing of the Early Ballots**

Early ballots will be mailed beginning about 26 days before the election (late July). If you will be away from your regular mailing address at that time and wish to have your ballot mailed to another address, please contact the City Clerk Department at the phone number listed below. The early ballot packet will include instructions for voting the ballot. Completed early ballots must be received by the City Clerk Department by 7 p.m. on Election Day, Tuesday, Aug. 25, 2015. The ballots may be returned by mail, be delivered to the City Clerk Department at City Hall, 200 W. Washington St., or dropped off at any voting center location.

#### **Early Voting Locations**

Voters who wish to vote early may vote early at Phoenix City Hall, 200 W. Washington St., 15th floor, between Thursday, July 30 and Friday, Aug. 21.
