Any individual or family can host a block party for a variety of occasions. Consider hosting a block party to introduce yourself and get to know your neighbors. The Neighborhood Association can be helpful in a variety of ways, from giving tips and what has worked in the past (or not worked) and helping cover the cost of the permit required by the city (if you want to temporarily block the street from vehicles driving through). Block parties are also ideal for birthdays, anniversaries, graduations and many of life's other celebrations. They are great opportunities for kids to get to know other children in the area and for adults and parents to form connections. Knowing your neighbors is about more than having someone to borrow eggs from when you run out. It also in-creases your safety and the safety of your neighborhood when neighbors know and look out for

2015 Yards & (NCE) Neighborhood Code Enforcement

I know it seems a little Early yet. But Grass and Weed violations will go into effect on May 4th. The public should call 311 to report a possible violation, where weeds or grass are at least NINE INCHES or TALLER.

The weed violation process includes the posting of a notice in the cited yard, plus a letter sent by the City to the owner of record. Property owners then have five days to correct the violation. If the grass or weeds are not cut after that time, the City's mowing contractor will cut the lawn, and the owner will be charged for the contractor's work. If you do not pay fee a lean is put on the property taxes.

"Neighborhood Code Enforcement plays a critical role in maintaining the health and safety of our community," said Cindy Joyner, deputy director for Neighborhood Code Enforcement. "It's important to ensure that our neighborhoods are well-maintained and attractive in order to protect property values; to include pest control, the Weed Program is an important part of that effort."

This year, the City has eight seasonal, part-time employees dedicated to weed violations. They inspect complaints and proactively identify violations. Five days after the initial posting, the mowing contractors check if property owners are in compliance and, if not, the contractors mow the yard and take date- stamped before and after photos.

Provide the neighborhood with an effective communication link with local government officials and other influential groups.



Chaining Dogs Outside

Dog owners who routinely chain their dogs outside will need to observe a new city law that limits how and when dogs can be tethered. As of January 2008, dogs are no longer allowed to be tethered between the hours of 11 p.m. and 6 a.m. During these hours dogs can be inside a fenced yard, kennel, or garage with a proper dog house.

- 1. No dog under the age of six months and no dog that hasn't been spayed or neutered can be tethered at any time, day or night.
- 2. Spayed and neutered dogs can be tethered between 6 a.m. and 11 p.m., but no more than three may be tethered at the same time on one property.
- 3. Multiple altered dogs may not have contact while they are tethered. The required six foot lead may not reach within three feet of another property, public thoroughfare, or right of way.

The law also prohibits tethering a dog at a home where Animal Control has had to untangle dog tethers more than two times in a year. The new tethering law is a major accomplishment for the welfare of dogs in Fort Wayne and towards the safety and livability of citizens.
