Message from the President

she was only going to stay a few minutes but managed to stay longer socializing; she also gave a cordial presentation. Everyone seemed to have had a good time. The children were especially fun to watch. They were filled with excitement as they anticipated going into the bounce house. Listening to their laughter made the entire event worthwhile; it truly felt like a community coming together. I want to thank **Lili Mireles Moreno**, our Treasurer, and **Gil Moreno**, our board member, for their terrific work in gathering donations from Cavender Toyota, HEB, and Grady's Bar-B-Q. Talking about communities coming together, it's the time of the year when we gather together to celebrate the holidays. Thanksgiving is my favorite holiday, a time to spend with family and friends. On November ninth we will have our annual JNA Turkey Bingo. In the past one could have won a frozen turkey, but times have changed, and we now have graduated to gift cards from HEB and baskets for the bingo prizes. We will start the evening with a short meeting and then proceed having fun playing bingo.

Although happy times are ahead of us we still have work to do, which leads me to write about the JNA boundaries. A simple concept but with many facets and more complicated than one might imagine. As Jefferson neighborhood, we are comprised of several overlays with other associations: Woodlawn Lake Community Association, Donaldson Terrace and District One.

One of the most interesting parts of the Jefferson Neighborhood is the area located across the street from Cool Crest Miniature Golf Course and the Oak Farms Dairy. The homes on the hill directly in front of these businesses are beautiful and rich in historical design. Most of the homes were built in the 30's in the Deco Era style.

Two homeowners in the area recently made zoning change requests from R-6 AHOD Residential Single-Family to R-6 HL AHOD Residential Single-Family Historic Landmark. This, simply stated, means they want to have their homes designated Historic Landmarks.

The JNA Board disagreed with the requests primarily because there were no outstanding features which set the homes apart from the rest of the neighborhood. Instead JNA is in the beginning stages of a new initiative, to try and preserve the entire area by having it become historic.



From SAISD Superitendent Pedro Martinez:

We learned last week that our very own Young Women's Leadership Academy was named a 2015 National Blue Ribbon School, one of only 303 public and private exemplary high-performing schools in the nation to receive the honor. An additional 32 schools earned Blue Ribbon status for their progress.

This honor could not have come at a better time for SAISD, as we seek to redefine excellence across the District. YWLA is an example of what we plan to achieve as a whole. Contributing to the success of the all-girls school is that each of its students are enrolled in pre-Advanced Placement or Advanced Placement courses, an approach we want to take to scale over time. I know it is possible.

I spent the past couple of weeks in meetings and at events that are serving to lay the foundation for our transformation and helping spread the word about where SAISD is headed, as well as gather in put. This includes our ongoing community meetings presenting our 5-Year Plan. The feedback and reactions we are getting continue to be very positive. I also had the opportunity to share our goals with more than 200 of our proud fathers and other male role models who attended our recent Fathers in Action luncheon. They were very positive about the direction our district is going.

To ensure that our students are college-ready, one of the changes we plan to make is to redesign our career and technical education pathways so they directly align to community colleges and 4-year universities. As a first step, on Sept. 23, all of our high school principals visited Palo Alto College, San Antonio College and St. Philip's College to get a first-hand look at the programs and facilities to begin the

conversation about how we will partner to ensure each of our programs can achieve dual credit and leverage our resources. I appreciate all of the positive feedback we received from our high school principals.

Also, we are working to be much more visible in classrooms than ever before. Our deputy superintendent, assistant superintendents and curriculum officers are spending more time in our schools observing the many good things happening in our classrooms and working with our principals to identify areas of support, such as needs in professional development, materials and technology. These are areas that we want to develop long-term plans to support.

As I visit schools and classrooms, I am seeing a lot of hardworking staff. I have been especially impressed with the passion and energy of our teachers and the rigor of bilingual education classrooms. We will continue to engage staff as we look at changes to our curriculum, assessments and instruction.

I want to again congratulate Highland Hills Elementary School music teacher Jason Jones and Rogers Middle School librarian Jennifer De Waelsche, who recently were recognized at our SAISD Foundation's Fifth Annual Inspire Awards. They are just two examples of the amazing educators we have in our District. This event was the highest-grossing ever for our foundation, with more than 330 attendees. It is evident that we are building excitement and support for our long-term goals.




This will be the first of two summits planned for the 2015-16 school year. Sponsor for the fall ParentSummit is the Trinity University Center for Educational Leadership.

Projected boundaries will extend from Summit Ave to Zarzamora to Fredericksburg Rd. It will also include Mulberry, Magnolia, Huisache and possibly Mistletoe from Zarzamora to Fred Rd. This area is not etched in stone and subject to change.

The process is lengthy but can be accomplished if the home owners in the area are motivated and willing to preserve this neighborhood. It would be pity to have developers have this area rezoned commercial. When you have the opportunity drive up and down some of the streets mentioned, I believe it will give you an idea of how beautiful our neighborhood once appeared as one drove up the hill to play miniature golf.

We also plan to take on another initiative for a neighborhood which is currently in the conservation district to be reviewed for historical district designation. I will provide you with more information as we begin to lay the groundwork. These are some of the plans for the coming year. I just want to keep everyone in the loop on what JNA has briefly discussed at our board meetings.

These changes are for the betterment of our community. I appreciate your support and input concerning these issues. Your involvement plays an important role in these matters. We will discuss some of these issues at our upcoming meetings. Please stay active and be heard.
