DIBBLE'S HOBBIES

When I approached **Dibble's Hobbies** I was on a mission. The Jefferson Neighborhood Association Newsletter printed information from the City of San Antonio about grant funds available for renovations of

strip mall facades in our neighborhood. Operation FACELIFT as it is known had a 5 day deadline left. When I realized this I was determined that everyone on the Jefferson Village strip was going to hear about the grant and understand the urgency of the matter.

Although my level of enthusiasm was off the charts, when I approached the hobby

store I was somewhat apprehensive. The façade in front of me was of pink 1" x1" tile. I thought to myself this place, if any place, could surely benefit from the grant, but I wasn't sure what to expect when I opened the door for the first time, even though I've lived in this area since 1957. My first impression was disbelief: It was like stepping into the past during the era of Woolworth, Kress and Winn's, with old waxed floors and the same smell, reminiscent of childhood days when I would walk into one of these stores and spend my allowance of 50 cents on whatever I wanted. Dibbles however has much more to offer, with an abundance

of neatly ordered, model trains, airplane models, games for children and collectors. It was incredible finding this nostalgic part of history right in our neighborhood. I proceeded to ask for the owner, Mr. Dibbles, and the only other person in the store, a clerk nodded towards him. As I approached him I explained the urgency in the matter of applying for the grant but he calmly mentioned something about his pink tile, stating that he liked it and that business was quiet.

I went on and on about the quality of the merchandise and that he needed to make things happen. I couldn't believe the calm nature of Mr. Dibbles and conversely I am sure he had the opposite opinion of

> I later heard that Mr. Dibbles is **Jeff Chladek**, a co-manager, who has been down this road many times. He also has generations of followers and during the holidays you will see grandfathers with grandchildren walking

into the store together.

I recently walked in Dibbles during the holidays and was partially successful in being discreet. I pretended I had never walked in the store and did not make eye contact with anyone. I was however able to watch many customers walking in asking questions about certain games or train models.



- Person #2 can choose to steal the first person's gift or to get a new gift.
- When a person's gift is stolen, that person can either choose another wrapped gift to open or can steal from another player.
- There are only 2 steals permitted for each gift. Thereafter the gift remains with whoever has the gift.
- The game is over when the last person (who is also #1) makes a decision to keep his or her present or to steal a present.
