
HAPPY NEW YEAR, 2016!!

CHRISTMAS TREE RECYCLING

The Public Works Department offers Phoenix residents a green way to take down their Christmas trees and



- Bring the tree unbagged.
- Remove all decorations, lights and tinsel.
- Remove the tree stand and all nails/ metal stakes.
- Secure tree during transport. Tie it down with material that can be untied or cut easily.
- Only dispose of trees in marked dropoff areas.

Sites accept single trees from city of Phoenix residents. For multiple tree loads, contact 602-262-7251.

Holiday Recycling

In addition to Christmas tree recycling, the Public Works Department would like to help Phoenix residents take the guesswork out of recycling by providing tips on which materials can be recycled, reused and reconsidered for a more sustainable holiday season. Please share these holiday recycling tips with your neighbors.

Place in your blue recycling container:

- Paper wrapping materials with no embossments, glitter and/or flocking
- Paper greeting cards and envelopes with no glitter, embossments and/or flocking
- Cardboard boxes that gifts were packaged in, such as children's toys and electronics

Hard plastics used for packaging foods, toys, electronics, etc.

Do not place in your blue recycling container:

- Foil-embossed papers and any material with glitter
- Ribbons and bows
- Plastic wrap from gift baskets, grocery shopping or packaging
- Photo greeting cards printed on photography paper
- Food waste should be composted, not placed in your recycling bin. If composting is not an option, it should be bagged and tied and placed in your trash container Polystyrene foam (Styrofoam)products, such as food packaging or drinkware

died in traffic incidents. 10 years ago Amy was in a horrific crash leaving her in a coma for a month, not expected to live. She was a college scholarship softball player. Miraculously she began to slowly heal, coming out of the coma, eventually engaging in physical therapy, and moving from a wheel chair to learning to walk again. It took years, but she graduated from college and is now a full time personal trainer with one of our Omaha partners, the YMCA.

Cassidy shares a similar story as she was in a crash in which her best friend, Kylie Jo Remmereid, died. She is four years into her recovery, with much help from Kylie's family who has stood with her every step of the way. As a result, when Amy met Cassidy for the first time, she was able to share her story of recovery, offering hope to Cassidy as she continues to make strides in getting back on her feet one day. As Amy shared with me, Cassidy gave her a kiss on the cheek before they parted. A true reason to smile.



New Tax Credit Donation Deadline

Arizona law provides a tax credit for contributions to public schools which support extracurricular activities and character education

programs. Your contribution will immediately go to support the high school program of YOUR choice. A tax credit is different from a deduction, because you may subtract the whole contribution from the amount of taxes you may owe the state of Arizona. An individual may contribute as much as \$200, and a couple filing jointly may contribute as much as \$400 to a public school and receive the money back in the form of a tax credit. To be eligible for a state tax credit in 2015, your contribution must be received or postmarked by April 15, 2016.






