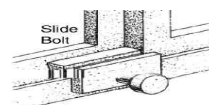

BURGLARY PREVENTION TIPS

Info provided by the City of Phoenix

Spring is here, take stock of your
house and follow some tips for
crime prevention



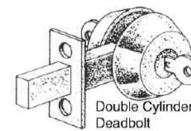
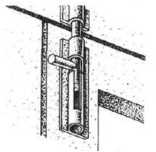
ARCADIA DOORS

Many burglars enter homes
through poorly
protected arcadia (sliding)
doors. Additional
locks and security measures

here will prevent
the door from being opened or lifted out of the
track. Install screws in the track above the sliding
door frame. Drill a pilot hole in the top track above
and slightly in from each corner of the sliding door
frame section. Install and adjust the screw so the
head barely clears the frame when it is moved back
and forth.

DOUBLE DOORS

These doors need solid security as
they are easily jimmied or forced
open. Flush level bolts installed at
the top and bottom of the doors are
recommended. Make sure the bolt
is long, sturdy and mounted into a
solid frame.



DOORS WITH WINDOWS

For doors with windows or glass
ornamentation consider having
a "capture key" deadbolt lock.
When you leave your home, you
can lock the door from the out-
side, making sure the interior key is NOT left inside
the door. This prevents a burglar from reaching
inside to unlock the door after breaking the
window. Keep the key in the lock anytime
someone is home. This is necessary for easy
exit in case of fire or other emergency.

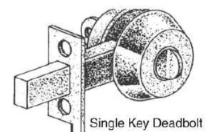
DEADBOLT LOCKS

A deadbolt lock can provide good protection. When
you turn the key, the lock mechanism slides a strong
metal bolt from the door into the frame. When you
buy a deadbolt lock, make sure:

- The bolt extends at least one inch from
the edge of the doors.
- The connecting screws holding the lock are on the
inside of the door.
- The strike plate is attached to the door frame with
screws that measure at least three inches in length.
- The cylinder has a steel guard around the key sec-
tion. The cylinder guard should be tapered or rotate
freely around this section to prevent wrenching if it is
twisted.

Types of Deadbolts

- A single key deadbolt lock
uses a thumb latch on the
inside.
- A capture key deadbolt lock
utilizes a deadbolt that key
locks from both sides. Howev-
er, when the deadbolt is locked from the inside, the
key is "captured" so it becomes a thumb turn for
interior safety and unable to be removed until the
deadbolt is physically unlocked.



- WHEN USING A CAPTURE KEY DEADBOLT
LOCK, KEEP THE KEY IN THE LOCK ANYTIME
SOMEONE IS HOME!

Additional Safeguards Against Burglary

- Engrave your valuables with your Arizona driver's
license number for easier identification and return.
- Videotape, photograph and inventory your valua-
bles.
- Keep these records in a safe place away from home.
- Add a strong padlock and hasp to storage areas
and
backyard gates.
- Use low voltage lighting around your house all
night long.
- Consider an alarm for your residence.

www.bolocop.com is web-based delivery system built by law enforcement to be used by law enforcement to provide direct communication to businesses and community members. The service is free and there will never be a cost associated with using or receiving BOLO/ALERTS! Simply go to www.bolocop.com and register for the alerts. You can choose alerts for the state, a city or just your zip code You can help police solve crimes in your community if you're willing to "BOLO" (Be On the Look Out). An easy way to do this is to register at BOLOCop.com, a web-based communication program that will send you alerts from law enforcement agencies seeking the public's help on a range of public safety issues, including locating missing persons, identifying probation violation offenders, and recovering stolen property. The service also distributes information about crime trends that may be impacting your neighborhood. Created in 2012 by Gilbert Police Crime Prevention Officer Vickie Owen and website developer Steven Mueller, BOLO Cop is used by hundreds of federal and state law enforcement officials to distribute critical police information in a variety of ways to individuals and businesses.

SWIMMING POOL SAFETY

All swimming pools, spas and hot tubs are required to have **barriers installed** and maintained that enclose and separate them from any dwelling.

A swimming pool, spa or hot tub is defined as any structure intended for swimming, diving or recreational bathing that contains water 24 inches or more in depth.



All pools, spas and hot tubs within the City of Phoenix are required to be fenced with exterior fencing and most pools also require an interior barrier. It depends on when the pool was built.

The City of Phoenix requires all pools to be checked for code compliance and health and safety issues. Select from the PDF pool topics below for additional information
