#### **Third Lowest Crime Rate in Houston**

District K has the third lowest crime rate of the 11 Houston City Council districts. The perception is otherwise. The Hiram Clarke area which is a part of District K is perceived as a high-crime area. However, that perception is inaccurate.

According to the Houston Police Department statistics, District K had a total of 9, 415 violent crimes in 2015.

These crimes include murder, rape, robbery, aggravated as-

Sault, theft, and auto theft. City Council District E had 5, 918, and City Council District G had 8,769.

In 2014, there were a total of 9, 755 crimes. As you can see, crime decreased by 340. That's good news indeed.
