The words "journal" and "journey" are derived from the same root, the French word, "jour," which means "day." The original function of a journal is to record day-to-day living including personal commentary and reflections, feelings, and ideas.

Wikipedia says: A diary (journal or notebook) is a record of what has happened over the course of a day or a period. 1. What do you mean by personal attacks?

It's OK to disagree with someone on Nextdoor. In fact, one of the purposes of Nextdoor is to provide a venue where neighbors can discuss important local issues -- and that will inevitably lead to some disagreements. But when you disagree, it's critical that the discussion remain civil and neighborly on Nextdoor, which means expressing disagreement with the person's position or actions rather than attacking their character or calling them names. For example, describing someone as "dishonest" or a "liar" is never appropriate on Nextdoor,

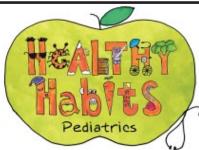

even if you believe it to be true. Instead, describe what the person did (assuming it's relevant to the neighborhood and not simply a personal dispute), but let others draw their own conclusions as to what it means about someone's character more generally.

Interpreting the Guidelines

16. Who decides how these Guidelines should be interpreted for the neighborhood?

Nextdoor Leads are tasked with applying these Guidelines to their neighborhood. If you have concerns that the Leads of your neighborhood are interpreting these Guidelines wrongly or inconsistently, send the Leads a private message to try and resolve your concerns. If you are unable to do so, then contact Nextdoor Support. Note that it is always considered wrong to complain about how Nextdoor is being run or why a message was flagged or removed on the main newsfeed. But if you wish to discuss these issues with your neighbors, it is considered appropriate to create a group for this purpose so that other members who are interested can join in a discussion of the standards of behavior for Nextdoor in your neighborhood. Understanding Adverse Food Reactions

The three main types of adverse food reactions include: allergies, intolerances, and sensitivities. It is critical to understand the differences between each reaction and to learn the methods to determine if your body is affected from them.



A food allergy is a reaction that occurs when the immune system overreacts to a specific food. The immune system produces IgE antibodies to protect the body. Symptoms can range in severity and may appear immediately. A serious allergic reaction called anaphylaxis is life threatening and requires immediate medical treatment. Allergic reactions may affect the skin, mouth, eyes, lungs, and GI tract. Symptoms can include: a rash, hives, wheezing, and swelling. A skin test or a blood test can indicate whether IgE antibodies are present.

A food intolerance is non-IgE mediated and refers to difficulty in digesting certain foods. Food intolerances are generally caused from an absence of enzymes. The onset of symptoms may be delayed and last hours after consuming the trouble food. Symptoms can include: headaches, migraines, runny nose, and stomach issues. A hydrogen breath test or a blood test determines lactose intolerance. A guided elimination program can help to identify trigger foods.

A food sensitivity is a non-IgE immune cell response, which leads to inflammation in the body. The symptoms are delayed and can take anywhere from thirty minutes to two days to show up in the body. Identifying the specific food can be difficult with delayed reactions. Symptoms can include: bloating, gas, diarrhea, heartburn, joint pain, brain fog, and fatigue. A clinical blood test called ALCAT measures your white blood cells inflammatory response to specific foods. A guided elimination program can also help to identify food sensitivities.

Pet Care Advice

The weather is finally warming up. Mosquitoes will start making their appearance soon which means heart worm season is upon us. Yet many Coloradans are uninformed about heart worms and are unaware that their dogs need to be on heart worm prevention. Heart worms are a parasitic roundworm transmitted by infected mosquitoes. Heart worms are dangerous, possibly fatal and costly to treat. The treatment is also potentially dangerous. Luckily preventing heart worms is easy and affordable. While Colorado sees far fewer heart worm positive cases per year than warmer, wetter states like Texas & Louisiana, the number of cases in our state has been steadily rising. The current recommendation from the American Heart worm Association is that dogs living in Colorado should be on heart worm prevention medication year round. From the time that your pooch is bitten by an infected mosquito it takes 6 months for this parasite to develop into a reproducing adult infecting the heart. If a dog has been off of heart worm prevention medication for 6 months or more then the dog should be tested prior to starting prevention. Administering prevention medication to a dog that is heart worm positive is potentially dangerous for that animal. Many heart worm prevention medications also have the added benefit of protecting dogs from intestinal parasites. Intestinal parasites are obviously bad for your pet but these parasites are also zoonotic and can be passed to people. This is a particular risk for children as they

tend to not be as thorough about hand washing as we would like. So the monthly de-worming for dogs is a matter of public health as well. Heart worm prevention medication is sensitive to temperature & light. If you are out running errands when you pick up your dog's medication, make sure you don't leave it in a hot car if you are not going strait home. With today's smart-phones it's easy to set up a monthly reminder to give your dog his heart worm pill. Talk to your Veterinarian about heart worm prevention today. Mother's Day: A Short History The second Sunday in May was officially proclain

The second Sunday in May was officially proclaimed "Mother's Day" by President Woodrow Wilson in 1914. But it had a long history before then. In the 19th century, Anna Reeves Jarvis organized Mother's Work Day to heighten awareness of local sanitation issues in her home state of West Virginia, and then expanded her efforts to improve health and sanitation during the Civil War. Julia Ward Howe (who wrote the words to "The Battle Hymn of the Republic") promoted a "Mother's Day for Peace" in 1872.

On May 9, 1905, Anna Reeve Jarvis's daughter, Anna Marie Jarvis, privately commemorated her mother's death two years before. Then, in 1908, Jarvis organized a larger celebration of moth-

erhood at her church in Grafton, West Virginia, with more than 400 children and their mothers participating. After that, Jarvis began working for a national day of recognition for mothers. West Virginia recognized Mother's Day first, in 1912, followed by Wilson's proclamation in 1914.

Ironically, the younger Jarvis never had any children of her own.
