Are You Oversharing on Public Wi-Fi? Connecting to the Internet in a public space like a coffee shop, the library or an airport is a wonderful modern convenience, but it comes with significant risk. Public Wi-Fi is never private, so we are

asking for your help in preventing Wi-Fi fraud!

HOW IT WORKS:

Fraudsters have come up with a number of ways to steal information from you or attack your computer while you are on public Wi-Fi. New hacking tools that are available free online make it easy even for novice hackers to compromise your security.

WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW:

It is never safe to assume any privacy on public Wi-Fi, even when prompted for a password. Anything you do on public Wi-Fi – entering a password, typing in a credit card number, accessing a bank account puts you at risk

WHAT YOU SHOULD DO:

Keep your surfing safe when on public Wi-Fi by sticking to things like reading the news and checking the weather. In short, never do anything on public Wi-Fi that requires a password.

Upcoming WESD Bond Election

Another WESD bond is on the ballot for the **November 8** election for additional school improvements. Here are some facts:

For what? This money will be used for safety projects, buildings projects and replacements, parking lot renovations, technology and school buses.

How were projects determined? The priority was determined based on student safety and need.

Why does WESD need the money? Since the 2008-09 school year, state capital funding has been drastically reduced or eliminated. The state has entirely eliminated building renewal funds (for building renovations and preventive maintenance) and the state's most recent budget funds less than 15% of the statutory allocation for items such as furniture, equipment, technology and buses.

What about Prop. 123? This money was used for employee compensation in an effort to attract and retain employees.

How is a bond different? This money will be used for things like buildings, technology and buses (for tangible items).

What happens if it doesn't pass? It will be necessary to reduce the district operating budget in order to pay for critical capital needs.

If the bond passes, will my taxes go up? The structure of this bond plan is to avoid an increase in taxes.

PHOENIX POLICE MEDIA ADVISORY-INTERNET EXCHANGE RELATED CRIMES

The Phoenix Police Department has recently experienced reported crimes specific to the usage of internet exchange sites that allow sellers to advertise items for sale and then interact with buyers. Subsequent to the online interaction, the two parties usually meet and exchange money for goods in a private party transaction at an agreed-upon location. However, due to circumstances surrounding the nature of these interactions, many criminals are using them for their own purposes. Specifically, we have seen an increase in robberies of one of the involved parties by the other party during these exchanges. However, crimes as serious as homicide and kidnapping have been linked to these transactions. Although no strategy is 100% effective when trying to be safe, there are a number of steps one can take to ensure the transaction is done under the safest possible circumstances. We are urging those involved in these private, internet-based sales transactions to consider the following while finalizing the deal and making safety their primary consideration:

- If the deal seems too good to be true, it probably is
- The location of the exchange should be somewhere in public that has many people around like a mall, a well-traveled parking lot, or a public area. Do not agree to meet at someone's house, a secluded place, a vacant house, or the like.
- Try to schedule the transaction while it is still daylight, or at least in a place that is very well lit
- Ask why the person is selling the item and what type of payment they will accept. Be wary of agreeing to a cash payment and then travelling to the deal with a large sum of cash.
- Bring a friend with you to the meet and let someone who isn't going with you know where you are going and when you can be expected back
- Know the fair market value of the item you are purchasing
- Trust your instinct! If something seems suspicious, or you get a bad feeling, pass on the deal!

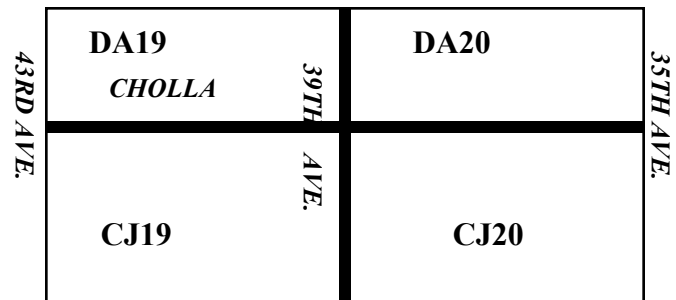

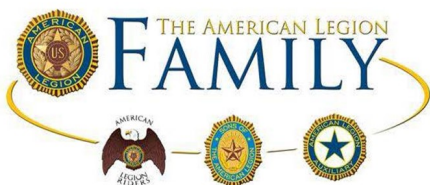

Researchers are providing more evidence each day of an important connection between your overall health and your oral health. Here are just some of the ways in which periodontal disease, or gum disease, may affect other conditions you have or those that you might develop.

With **heart disease and stroke**, the facts are compelling. People with periodontal disease are almost twice as likely to suffer from coronary artery disease as those with disease-free gums. One study found that 85% of heart patients studied had periodontal disease. The most likely explanation is that somehow plaque and oral bacteria find their way into the blood stream and contribute to the thickening of the walls of the coronary arteries. **Diabetes** and gum disease affect each other equally.
