Safety & Security in Columbine West

KEEP OUR CHILDREN SAFE - KEEP OUR NEIGHBORS SAFE

We live in a society today where crime is becoming an everyday focus. Drug manufacturing, sales and deliveries are made in broad daylight and in the late hours. Those same drugs and needles are found in the street and gutters by our children and grand-children. Add to that, car theft rings with high speed chases, felons driving or running through our neighborhoods to avoid capture, the harboring of those felons, bounty hunters with AK's, obscene sexual activities on the street in view of anyone, harassment of neighbors, garage sales with stolen property being offered and we have an environment that can become violent and dangerous at any time.

Those of us living in Columbine give thanks that we do not live in high crime areas such as Chicago, New York and the various inner city areas that are consistently in the news, yet friends and neighbors, we <u>are</u> talking about Columbine West.

Since the beginning of October there has been (2) major drug raids with 8 arrests, located on Fremont Drive near Webster. Another house located on Roxbury near Pierce, there were 2 arrests the same evening and more have followed. Offenders living this life of crime are walking our streets and driving through our neighborhoods, while on a revolving door basis with arrests, bail and returning to these houses. Unfortunately some of us in Columbine West who happen to live across the street or nearby have been subject to too much open ended crime and destruction to our "great place to live" in Columbine West. To mention it has gone on for too long is an understatement; 20 years is way too long to be bombarded with this insanity. Another account of neighborhood crime is "rolling meth labs" driving through Columbine on their way to a small shopping center on Peakview west of Wadsworth or in the shopping center near Dairy Queen on Pierce.

Fortunately, we now have a sheriff's department actively investigating, arresting and chasing down these types of events. Because of their outstanding efforts, the leadership of Captain Happ and the assistance of the Boulder County DA office, Prosecutor Sean Finn,

we can look forward to progress. No more deferred prosecutions or total lack of charges from the Jefferson County DA's Office.

We must be willing to help law enforcement and step forward when we see suspicious activity. We must support, and most importantly, appreciate the efforts of both departments. It is important to let them know

we support their efforts and will do anything and everything they request or need.

Suspicious activity needs to be reported to the dispatchers at 303-271-0211 or on the anonymous tip line at 303-271-5612. That activity includes but is not limited to:

• The older, run down, unmaintained motor homes that move from house to house; appear repeatedly for short period of time only to be followed by numerous arrivals

Safety & Security, continued from front page _ of unknown vehicles for five or ten minute intervals.

- · Cars with expired and most times non-legible temp tags
- that do not belong in the neighborhood. Cars may also be noted having a front plate different from the rear.
- Noxious odors emanating from unmaintained and rundown houses all hours of the day or night.
- Enormous amounts of trash consistently left for pickup meth labs generate a lot of trash.
- Numerous vehicles arriving and departing for 5 or 10 minutes visits that do not belong in the neighborhood. Cars, trucks, vans and motorcycles are seen at the houses and in our parks in the area. One seller used a moped for a while last year in the parks.
- Strangers walking through our neighborhoods. They usually have a backpack and numerous bags with their belongings.
- Any other activity that seems to be out of the ordinary in your area or strangers that do not belong there.

To all of our neighbors in the Columbine West community, we must keep in mind that criminal activity is occurring in our neighborhoods on a daily basis. Our children and grandchildren may be walking past these houses on the way to school, while riding their bikes or to play in the parks; the same parks being used to promote the drug sales. Vehicles are cruising through our neighborhood speeding, while the drivers are high on drugs, alcohol or something else. In fact one of these offenders rammed a sheriff's cruisers, at the Fremont Drive house.

Please be advised, sharing this information is not an attempt to scare or overly excite our community, but our neighborhood needs to remain alert and aware so every effort is made to support our sheriff department. Those few of us who are living what can be considered a nightmare need the communities efforts. A group of dedicated neighbors attended the October CWCA monthly meeting. We spoke out loud and clear to the association volunteers. We voiced our opinions. Everyone in attendance agreed we needed to have more representation from our local law enforcement to get a clearer picture of just what exactly can be done.

There will be a CWCA meeting on November 9th at 7:00 p.m. at Dutch Creek to address these issues. We will attempt to have Captain Happ or an officer and possibly Prosecutor Finn or a member of his staff at the meeting. Please, let's get involved and help our law enforcement which will in turn, help us all.

Behind the Badge: The Power of Crime Prevention

Did you know about two thirds of car "break-in" in Jefferson County happen to cars left unlocked? Meaning there's no "break-in" at all. As of the first of October, 634 car trespasses were reported in JeffCo. Of those, 66 percent were unforced. Clearly, criminals take the path of least resistance. Unfortunately, minor crimes like car trespasses often involve the theft of identifying materials like credit cards, licenses, or registrations – allowing thieves to commit much bigger identity theft crimes soon after. Since criminals usually look for the lowest-hanging fruit, prevention methods are effective in keeping crime rates low. Yes, there will always be unpredictable and unpreventable crimes. But we know many of the crimes in our county can be prevented. The Sheriff's Office has a dedicated team of certified crime prevention deputies whose sole purpose is to work with citizens to prevent crime. Through on-site visits, phone calls, special events, child safety activities, and other opportunities, these deputies share vital information with the public on how to keep crime at bay. Here are some ways you can take advantage of the services they provide.

SPEAKING ENGAGEMENTS: Our crime prevention team hits the road to speak at businesses, association meetings, service clubs and even scout meetings. They instruct bank employees on what to do in a robbery, construction companies on preventing copper theft, and school groups on responsible reporting. They are available to speak to your organization on a variety of public safety topics.

SPECIAL EVENTS: Crime prevention deputies attend dozens of community events throughout the year, distributing literature on topics from nuisance dogs to sex offenders. They answer questions and share information about crime and quality-of-life issues in JeffCo. Some of the events where you'll find us include the County Fair and Festival;

the Rhubarb Festival; Red, White and You; and the Sheriff's Safety Fair.



HOME SECURITY SURVEYS: One of the services that our team provides is an on-site security survey. A deputy will evaluate your house's strengths and weaknesses, including locks, lighting and landscaping. They then recommend changes that make the building more secure. The process takes about an hour and is also available to businesses and places of worship.

NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH: The crime prevention deputies administer the Neighborhood Watch program throughout the county. There are currently more than 30 active Neighborhood Watch groups in our county, whose vigilant residents work with law enforcement to identify, prevent, and solve crimes close to home.

NATIONAL NIGHT OUT: National Night Out is a series of local celebrations held on the first Tuesday in August each year. NNO gives neighbors an opportunity to get together in a setting close to home. Of the many crime prevention strategies, communication among neighbors ranks among the most effective. NNO is also an opportunity for deputies to interact with residents in a positive, relaxed, and informal way.
