ONE TINY THING

In the Sunburst's January issue, we talked about how recycling helps manage waste and resources, so that future generations may have the same commodities we have. So, what happens to those things we don't recycle? I've compiled a list from different sources that give approximate decomposition rates of commonly used items. It's important to note that these same items can take much, much longer to decompose if buried in a landfill. Please note, that even though a plastic item breaks down, the particles never go away.

How long an item will take to break down if left out in the environment

Here in San Antonio, we have been provided with recycle bins (blue) and compost bins (green). In January, I shared how I separate the trash from the recycle in my home, but I think one of the problems in separating the compost from the trash in our homes is that it's stinky. To resolve this, I re-use a plastic zipper bag to put veggies, coffee grounds, egg shells, etc. and place it inside the freezer. On Sunday night, I put the frozen compost in a paper bag and out it goes to the green bin. I also keep a cereal box on top of my counter to collect used napkins. When the box is filled it goes to the green bin. Just one tiny thing...for our future generations' sake.
