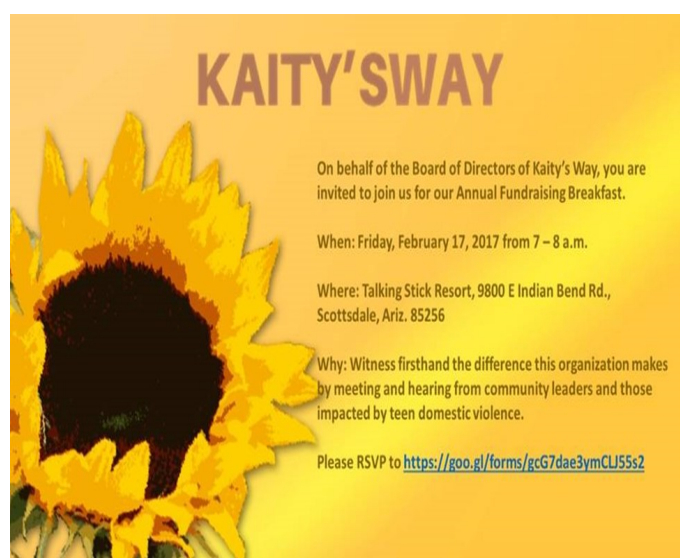


PHOENIX CHINESE WEEK 2017 CULTURE AND CUISINE FESTIVAL - YEAR OF THE ROOSTER

New Tax Credit Donation Dead- line

Arizona law provides a tax credit for contributions to public schools which support extracurricular activities and character education programs. Your contribution will immediately go to support the high school program of YOUR choice. A tax credit is different from a deduction, because you may subtract the whole contribution from the amount of taxes you may owe the state of Arizona. An individual may contribute as much as \$200, and a couple filing jointly may contribute as much as \$400 to a public school and receive the money back in the form of a tax credit. To be eligible for a state tax credit in 2016, your contribution must be received or postmarked by April 15, 2017. Tax Credit Donation forms are available at the Bookstore. The new system can be used on desktop computers, tablets and smart phones, and offers an easy-to-navigate button system to report and request city services. The city has retired the myPhxAZ app, which serviced only two departments, and replaced it with the new PHX At Your Service system that integrates forms and requests from 14 city departments.
