#### New Tax Credit Donation Deadline

Arizona law provides a tax credit for contributions to public schools which support extracurricular ac-

tivities and character education programs. Your contribution will immediately go to support the high school program of YOUR choice. A tax credit is different from a deduction, because you may subtract the whole contribution from the amount of taxes you may owe the state of Arizona. An individual may contribute as much as \$200, and a couple filing jointly may contribute as much as \$400 to a public school and receive the money back in the form of a tax credit. To be eligible for a state tax credit in 2016, your contribution must be received or postmarked by April 15, 2017. Tax Credit Donation forms are available at the Bookstore. 




