

Staying safe during the summer

It's easy for everyone to help keep our neighborhood safe. Follow these practices to prevent crime.

- » Report suspicious cars or people in your neighborhood. Report it immediately so police can respond quickly. Get a license plate number if you can safely
- » As the evenings get lighter and warmer and you go walking at night. take your cell phone to report any suspicious activities you see. Bring a flashlight to warn traffic if you can't walk on the sidewalk. If you walk late at night, bring a friend.
- » Use outside lighting on your house at night ... front and back.
- » Keep vour car doors locked whether in your own driveway or when out shopping or dining.
- » Keep your garage door closed when you aren't in the garage or driveway.

Sometimes, all it takes is for one or two incidents in a neighborhood to alarm residents. Keep an eye out for your neighbor's safety, and they will keep an eye out for you.

Have you paid your dues?

We collected 40% of household dues in 2016. This compares to 56% in 2015and 57% in 2014.

The majority, \$15, supports the Snow Removal Fund.

BWCA contracts with All About Lawns. If there's snow of 2" or more, All About Lawns plows for \$518/push. Salt, if needed, is extra at \$25 per 80 lbs.
