



## El Dorado Community Garden

Did you know the Fall is the best time to garden in San Antonio? With the heat of late August and September seeds and transplants grow faster. As it cools off in October and early November vegetables don't bolt and produce longer. In late November up to January some vegetables like snow peas, onions, scallions, lettuce, broccoli and cauliflower are at their best. Even wild flower seeds germinate in the Fall, remain as very small plants all winter and then flower like mad in Spring. So come on and RENT A BED FOR FALL 2017!

Those of you who rented in Spring 2017 have first choice. Bed rental is open to everyone else as well. The cost is \$25 for six months Aug 2017 to Jan 2018. Once I have your cash or check the bed is yours.

The beds will be cleared of plant material in late June 2017. Bed soil will be added and amended to improve fertility. Compost is making itself with Joe's help. Mulch has been spread around the beds. More mulch will be arriving to be put in the beds to further improve the soil. The grass outside the EDCG fence is being mowed regularly. The shade structure wall needs to be stained. The water cisterns are in place waiting for the rain to be "harvested" again. We will be getting ready so why not join us and RENT YOUR BED FOR FALL 2017!

Plus in September EDCG may sell tomato, squash and herb transplants, bunching green onion starts and more.


Beds are rented on a first come first served basis so don't miss out. Planting can begin late August 2017.



#### One Tiny Thing Go Green And Get Some Green

I mean, become more environmentally friendly and save money. Just these 5 adjustments, can save you tons of money.

1. Replace bottled water with a reusable water bottle.

If most of what you drink is bottled water, assuming you drink 64 oz. of water per day, you'd consume a little over 3 – 20 oz. bottles of water per day. Those 3 bottles per day would cost you about \$3.00 per day or \*\$1,095 per year. That same 1,095 bottles filled with tap water would cost you \*48 cents per year. Imagine what you could do with an extra \*\$1094.52 each year.

2. Replace burned out regular bulbs with CFL's.

CFL's consume about 75 percent less electricity and last up to 10 times longer. Replacing just one 75-watt incandescent bulb with a 25-watt CFL will save \*\$83.00 over the life of the bulb.

3. If it glows, unplug it at night.

Anything that glows even after you turn it off continues to draw power that you pay for. Plug them into power strips and before bed, flip the strip switch to cut the flow of electricity. If you unplug unecessary appliances and electronics that glow, you could save \*\$200.00 a year.

4. What is your energy consumption?

It's easier to save energy when you know exactly how much and where you're using it. Go to <u>residential.savenow.cpsenergy.com</u> for a free energy assessment and for free energy assessment products. On average, an energy audit shows how to save up to \*30 percent on utility bills.

5. Recycle or sell your unused electronics

Eliminate the MILLIONS of pounds of chemicals and heavy metals (by way of tossed electronics) that end up in the ground by going to mygreenelectronics.org to help you find a place to recycle electronics in San Antonio. The site also provides a list of electronics that are easier on the environment and your energy bill. But do it fast, as that website is up for sale.

\*These are approximations since it's difficult to calculate exactly how much money you would save because of use/cost variables
