

The National Park Service has predicted that the peak blooming period for the Yoshino Cherry Blossoms will be March 19 - 22. The peak bloom time for the Cherry Blossoms varies according to temperatures. Blooms have occurred as early as March 15 (1990) and as late as April 18 (1958).

Scientists at the Cary Institute of Ecosystems Studies in Millbrook, NY are anticipating 2017 to be a particularly risky year for Lyme's. White footed mice are said to be efficient transmitters of Lyme's.
