Mile High on the Cheap

Nowadays, there are many advantages to becoming a “senior citizen”, but the one bargain hunters appreciate the most are the discounts offered by many retailers and restaurants. We’ve rounded up a few deals around town for the “older crowd.”

Because few senior offers are heavily promoted, review the following guidelines:

- The definition of “senior” varies widely — the minimum age can be 50, 55, 60, 62 or 65. Ask first and be prepared to show a picture ID.
- Price and participation varies greatly. This is particularly true for fast-food restaurant chains. If you’re unsure, call ahead or ask a manager before ordering.
- Senior discounts may not apply to the entire party or bill — only the qualifying customer. Again, ask first.
- Many offers are limited to specific times of the day or days of the week. Double-check, before making plans.
- Senior discounts are not limited to national chains. Many locally owned businesses love older customers because of their loyalty. Stop by your favorite neighborhood spots and ask about deals.
- Know what you’re getting. Many restaurants offer a senior menu at a discounted price, but it also usually means smaller portions — so the true savings may be minimal or non-existent.
- Use your age to your family’s financial advantage. Consider tagging along with “the kids”, so they can use

your discount — especially at drug and craft stores that offer “Senior Days.”

- Several deals require an AARP membership which costs \$16 annually. The minimum age to join is 50. (The discounts alone are well-worth the price of membership.) Here is a small sample of discounts.
- Chick-Fil-A — Free small drink or coffee, along with a 10% discount for those 55+ at select locations.
- Einstein Bros. Bagels — 10% discount if you ask for it.
- CiCi’s Pizza — 10% off any pizza order or buffet ticket for those 60+.
- Sweet Tomatoes — \$7.99 Senior Special (beverage and coffee included) from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m. Monday to Thursday.
- Village Inn Restaurant — 10% off any meal or drink for those 60+.
- AMC Theater movies — \$5.38 with STUBS card on Tuesdays for seniors.
- National Parks Senior Pass — good for life. \$10 for now, but rising to \$80 later this year.
- Walgreens — 20% off regular-priced merchandise the first Tuesday of the month.

Marcia's Gardening Tips - Spring Blooming Plants and Pruning

With spring upon us, it is so nice to see blooming plants instead of snow. Often I am asked to identify a plant that someone has seen blooming and really wants to buy one for their yard. There are a variety of plants that bloom in early or late spring:

Early Blooming Plants

- Quince, Chaenomeles species: orange-red, pink or white
- Forsythia, Forsythia species: yellow
- Plums or Cherries, Prunus species: white or pink
- Rhododendron P.J.M: lavender
- Tulips, Narcissus, Crocus: most colors
- Creeping Phlox, Phlox subulata: white, pink, lavender/blue or red
- Basket of Gold, Aurinia saxatilis: gold
- Evergreen Candytuft, Iberis sempervirens: white
- False Forget-Me-Not: blue

Late Blooming Plants

- Serviceberry, Amelanchier species: white
- Redbud, Cercis species: lavender
- Flowering Crabapples, Malus Species: red, pink or white
- Peonies: red, pink or white
- Mockorange, Philadelphus species: white
- Ninebark, Physocarpus species: white
- Flowering Pear, Pyrus species: white
- Mountain Ash, sorbus species: creamy white
- Spirea species: white, rose, pink or red

- Lilac, Syringa species: various colors
- Weigela species: red, pink or white

A number of the above mentioned plants bloom before the leaves come out: Quince, Forsythia and Redbud. I recently read an article by Sandra Mason who is an Extension Educator, Horticulturist in Illinois. She has this to share about pruning early blooming plants: Forsythias have forced their last flower. Lilacs are in full bloom. Once these early flowering shrubs have flowered, it's time to get out the pruners. Other than being a rite of spring, pruning can promote new plant growth, maintain plant size, encourage flowering, remove diseased or dead limbs and help control insect and disease problems. However, timing is important, especially when pruning spring blooming shrubs. Early blooming shrubs develop their flower buds during the summer and fall of the previous year. Therefore, as a general rule, shrubs that flower before June 15 should be pruned immediately after flowering. Pruning these shrubs in late summer, fall or early spring will remove the flower buds and therefore the flowers for the season. Spring flowering shrubs are generally pruned by the renewal method. Each spring after flowering, prune out the largest stems to the ground to stimulate new growth from the crown and remaining stems. Heading back or shortening of stems may also be necessary to get shrubs in bounds. Removing old branches can lessen problems from lilac borer, scale and other insects as well as stem diseases.

Shrubs that should be pruned soon after flowering include lilac, mockorange, weigela, forsythia, arrowwood viburnum,

St. johnswort. Established shrubs of these can also be cut down by the rejuvenation method in February or March. Rejuvenation is the complete cutting of all stems down to 4 to 6 inch stubs. Rejuvenation is used when multi-stemmed plants become too large with too many stems to justify saving any one to two year old growth. In other words, the shrub is a tangled mess of stems. For particularly vigorous plants root pruning with a spade will reduce succulent growth after rejuvenation. Before pruning, examine the plant thoroughly. If you are new to pruning, tie a colorful ribbon or spray paint the branches to be removed to help you visualize what will be remaining. Shrub pruning requires a good set of pruning shears or loppers not hedge shears. At each cut of hedge shears, many new growing points are produced making the shrub very dense at the top. The dense growth causes the leaves in the interior of the plants to die. I hope you are getting out there and enjoying this beautiful springtime in Colorado. Enjoy!!!

Kiwanis Division Project: Ronald McDonald House

"Our homes are filled with more than help, they're filled with hope". Many families travel far from home and spend several weeks or months to get treatment for their seriously ill or injured children – a long time to be away or to divide a family. And, for children facing a serious medical crisis, nothing seems scarier than not having mom and dad close by for love and support. A Ronald McDonald House is that "home-away-from-home" for families so they can stay close by their hospitalized child at little or no cost. Our Houses are built on the simple idea that nothing else should matter when a family is focused on the health of their child – not where they can afford to stay, where they will get their next meal or where they will lay their head at night to rest. We believe that when a child is hospitalized the love and support of family is as powerful as the strongest medicine prescribed. The generosity of volunteers and donors make it all possible. In return, families either stay at no cost or are asked to make a donation up to \$25 per day, depending on the House. The RMHC Global Policy is that families are never turned away; if it's not possible to pay, the fee is waived.

Our vision: Kiwanis will be a positive influence in communities worldwide...so that one day, all children will wake up in communities that believe in them, nurture them and provide

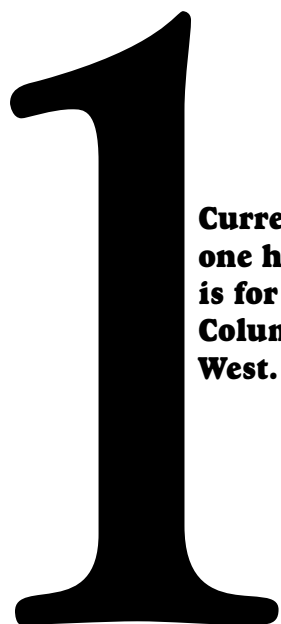
