Residential Speed Limit is 25 MPH

A study conducted by AAA shows that the fatality rates of autos vs. pedestrians vary from 25% at 25 MPH to a staggering 55% at 45 mph. This is based on standard size sedan and a 30 year old male in good health. So what does that say about children and their survival rates? There has been a tremendous amount of conversation lately surrounding the excessive speed neighbors are noticing on a daily basis. The major thoroughfares such as; Portland Ave., Webster Ave., Zephyr Ave. & Allison/ Ontario are areas that neighbors continue to watch other neighbors exceeding the 25 MPH Residential speed limit. Along with this there are individuals that are



disregarding the speed limit for speed bumps (15 MPH) and using the sidewalks to try and circumvent the bumps all together. In addition, many are now NOT stopping at certain neighborhood stop signs. At a recent CWCA monthly meeting we had neighbors voicing their frustrations. Neighbors with young kids are afraid to let the kids play out in their own front yards or ride their bikes on the sidewalks, for fear of an inattentive driver and their excessive driving speed. Does anyone have any idea why we are seeing this kind of behavior on our neighborhood streets? Does anyone have any ideas on how to potentially bring some resolutions to these issues? Let those drivers who do pay attention to the rules take back our neighborhood streets. Let all of us work together to address this problem and work towards a resolution. It is important for us parents to be good role models too. We are the first drivers our kids get to see and recognize how important good driving behavior really is. For those of us who have been driving the streets in Columbine West, please take a second and look at your speedometer as you leave the development. Are you within the 25 MPH Residential speed limit? Our newer cars can be very deceiving and make us think that we are truly driving 25 MPH. Driving the speed limit may take you a moment longer to reach your destination, yet the lives and lively hood of the neighborhood is at stake. It is extremely important to keep our kids from being the unintentional recipients of distracted drivers. Please give this your whole attention and be safe out there.



Sunscreen: Is It Safe For Your Skin?

Greetings from South Platte Park and the Carson Nature Center. We hope everyone's summer is into full fun-filled mode! Like many of you, many of our staff work (and play) long hours outside during the summer. Unfortunately a few of us have had sun induced skin issues, thankfully for the most part fairly minor things (knock on wood), and we are hearing and learning more and more about sun precautions.



Several active sunscreen ingredients including Retinyl Palmitate, Oxybenzone, and nanoparticles have been in the news with debates as to their safety. The American Society of Dermatologists and the Skin Cancer Foundation have reviewed studies that suggest these ingredients are dangerous, and they along with the FDA continue to stand behind these sunscreen ingredients. With any news like this, it is often good to do a bit of your own research to see what you're comfortable with. What type of sunscreen should you use? Here's several important keys:

- Apply sunscreen generously! Most people are far too skimpy with the amount of sunscreen they use. As a basis, consider the 1 ounce recommended amount when going under the sun in swim attire - that's about the size of a small golf ball in your palm!
- And reapply sunscreen every few hours! Most gets


- absorbed or sweated off, even "waterproof" types!
- Use sunscreen with SPF 30 or greater.
- Use sun protecting clothing as aid or in lieu of sunscreen if they make you uncomfortable!

Watch Your Waist in Your 40s to Avoid Dementia Later

Carrying belly weight during the 40s appears to increase the risk for dementia in the 70s, whereas carrying extra midsection weight later in life isn't as accurate an indicator. Researchers say these findings are disturbing because 50 percent of adults in the United States are considered abdominally obese.

Researchers at Kaiser Permanente studied 6,583 people who were between the ages of 40 and 45. An average of 36 years later, 16 percent of the participants—who had been measured for abdominal density—were diagnosed with dementia. Abdominal obesity increased the risk of dementia regardless of whether people had normal overall weight or were overweight or obese overall—and regardless of the health conditions including diabetes, cardiovascular disease, and stroke.
