Texas Transportation Code

Sec. 683.071. Junked Vehicle means a vehicle that is self-propelled and:

- displays and expired license plate or invalid vehicle inspection certificate or does not display a license plate or inspection certificate; and
- 2. is:
- a. wrecked, dismantled or partially dismantled or discarded; or
- inoperable and has remained inoperable for more than:
 - 7 consecutive hours, if on public property; or
 - 2. 30 consecutive days, if on private property.

Donate the vehicle and receive a tax credit. There are many place that want vehicle donations: Goodwill, Chanel 8, Salvation Army, et cetera. They will come and pick them up at no charge.

Neighborhood Heavy Tree and Junk Trash

Heavy tree trash pickup: tree trash, mixed with junk will not be picked up. No lumber as it may be chemically treated. Junk trash includes: furniture, appliances, other bulky material (lumber, fence material, and etcetera.). Appliances containing refrigerant must be tagged to certify that a qualified technician has removed the refrigerant. Heavy Junk or Tree trash may be put out the Friday before the weekend of the 4th Monday of the month. Junk trash may include small tree trash, but in (2) piles junk in one and tree trash separate, DO NOT MIX. Trash put out early or left out should be reported to 311 and is subject to fine by the city of Houston.
