What is the Neighborhood Preserva- tion Ordinance?

The Neighborhood Preservation Ordinance (NPO) is Chapter 39 of the Phoenix City Code. It was established to prevent and address deterioration, blight and/or hazardous conditions that can negatively impact neighborhoods. It provides established **minimum property maintenance standards for all structures and properties in the City.**

1. Dispose of trash properly
2. Park in designated areas
3. Remove visible outdoor storage
4. Maintain fences
5. Remove inoperable vehicles
6. Keep vacant buildings secure
7. Maintain vegetation

New Tax Credit Donation Deadline

Arizona law provides a tax credit for contributions to public schools which support extracurricular activities and character education programs. Your contribution will immediately go to support the high school program of YOUR choice. A tax credit is different from a deduction, because you may subtract the whole contribution from the amount of taxes you may owe the state of Arizona. An individual may contribute as much as \$200, and a couple filing jointly may contribute as much as \$400 to a public school and receive the money back in the form of a tax credit. To be eligible for a state tax credit in 2016, your contribution must be received or postmarked by April 15, 2017. Tax Credit Donation forms are available at the Bookstore. 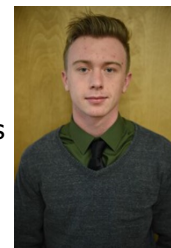

PHOENIX POLICE DEPARTMENT CALLS FOR SERVICE COMPARISON

Recently, the Phoenix Police Department made staffing changes and moved several positions to assist with patrol functions. Those changes were made to address an increase in calls for service and the time it took for officers to respond. The charts provided by the Police Department illustrate the increase of calls and the increase of response times over the past six years. As these charts show, it has taken officers longer to respond to the growing number of calls during this period which creates a higher risk to public safety. Having more officers on the street to respond to each type of call for service allows the police to answer the increasing number of incidents in a shorter period of time.

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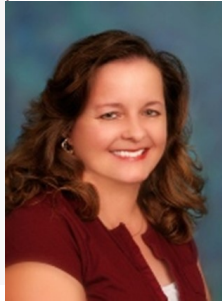
