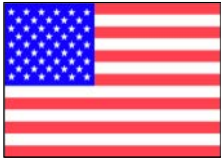

Candidate Forum Set for Feb 12

It's that time again when politics is in the air with candidates' signs displaying throughout the neighborhood. Did you know the Jefferson neighborhood is one of the most recognized neighborhoods for voter turnout? It was also an elite place to live from the late 1920's to the late 60's, a community where many folks enjoyed the short commute to the downtown area. The area has retained its political exuberance. We still have an abundance of residents who are politically engaged. In 1982 the **Jefferson Neighborhood Association (JNA)** was founded.

The Monticello Park Neighborhood and the Woodlawn Lake Neighborhood are similar but yet distinctively different. For example, the Monticello Park Historic District neighborhood has the historic 93 year old Bihl Haus built on the grounds of a dairy farm. It is now a nonprofit art gallery located on the grounds of the Primrose at Montecello Park Senior Apartments, host to many exhibits per year and where art classes are also given to seniors, and the Thomas Jefferson High School, a beautiful structure built on land originally intended for a deluxe hotel and golf course. This neighborhood is home to the **Monticello Park Neighborhood Association**. The Woodlawn Lake Neighborhood has the iconic Woodlawn Lake Park, the most-visited park in San Antonio. This neighborhood is home to the **Woodlawn Lake Community Association**.

The three neighborhood associations, JNA, MPNA and WLCA once again have come together to co-host another political forum. Invitations went to candidates for State and County offices to participate in the forum. All three associations are non-partisan.
