Log Inn Road History Nugget

Going back to 1650, Robert Burle patented 450 acres along what we now drive on daily, as Log Inn Road. The land was then sold to John Homewood (who also patented 210 acres on Whitehall Creek), who had a son named Thomas. Thomas Homewood married Anne Hammond, who eventually inherited the land, known then as "Burle's Banks" after Thomas died. Anne married William Govane, who mismanaged her estate. The Widow Govane held up transfer of St. Margaret's Church Whitehall glebe to Colonial Governor Horatio Sharpe.
