## Captain Brady Wise - Park Police

- Out of 259 incidents, 226 were taken care of.
- The HNA notified Park Police about dirt bikes and ATV's (All Terrain Vehicles) being ridden on park grounds. That activity is NOT allowed and the city will be installing signage prohibiting this activity in the future (Code 224-1)
- Any officer nearby will respond to gunshots reported.

Provide address of work/commercial vehicles being parked in residential driveways and along sidewalks.

## Tim Salas - Chief of Staff

- -Fliers were distributed for: School spring break camp for children.
  - Early voting for Bexar County with dates and where to vote.
- -Bond Program Design for Center should be completed October, 2019. Size of center (13,000 sq ft)

  Complex to be completed by May, 2020 Open by 2021. (land behind pool)
  - The HNA raised concerns about the loss of animal life at the duck pond (fish, turtles, ducks) and the presence of vultures feeding on the deceased animals to the city. As a result, the HNA will meet with the District 4 representatives and multiple city agencies to find a solution to the Association's concerns at the park.
  - -Large rat-like pests call "Nutrias" are in the duck pond bank living in the rocks and feed on the food that is left around the duck pond.
- -18 wheeler trucks cannot park in residential areas. As of March 1, a \$500 penalty will be cited for trucks parked in these areas regardless of signs posted or not.

## <u>Guest Speaker - Marc Jacobsen - Transportation and Capital Improvements Department.</u>

Traffic light at Emerald Glade and Potranco Rd was discussed. There are guidelines that have to be followed (i.e. amount of traffic, crash history, school zone, pedestrians). Not ideal to install a signal, due to oncoming traffic and lights at Hunt Lane, according to TCI.

## Ina M. Minjarez - State Representative - District 124

Although Ina Minjarez will be traveling, her staff will be attending the HNA meetings with any updates

Elbert Fuqua (developer) has decided forego zoning change to go forward with R-6 housing.

- -HNA is a recognized community service organization. Can provide certification for hours volunteered. (first Saturday of the month once program begins)
- -COP classes hours are 6pm to 9pm, at the police substation on March 22, 2018 at SAPD West substation.
