Prepared by Transportation & Capital Improvements

Project Scope:

• Construct street improvements including Wilson Boulevard median in the Jefferson High School Area. Improvements include underground utility conversion at the intersections of Wilson Boulevard and Donaldson Avenue, Wilson Boulevard and Club Drive. Includes sidewalks, lighting, landscaping, thespian island fountain restoration and other improvements as appropriate and within available funding.

Budget & Funding Sources:

• \$3.6M 2017 General Obligation Bond Program Project Schedule:

- Design begins in May 2018
- Design completes in March 2019
- Construction begins in September 2019

NEW CHANGES TO OUR ANIMAL LAWS

A complete ban on the use of chains of any weight as tethering for dogs

No more than one (1) rooster allowed per property within the city limits

Stricter spay neuter requirements for dogs legally declared dangerous or repeatedly impounded for roaming by ACS

Authorizing ACS Officers to impound pets sold in illegal locations like roadsides or flea markets or those without a litter permit

Increase in the allowable number of chickens on a property within the city limits to eight (8) (housing restrictions still apply)

Garden Notes

In the December-January JNA newsletter I mentioned that the Jefferson Community Garden (JCG) was headed in the wrong direction because there was no irrigation system to water the plants. Since then several community mem-

bers along with Judith Temple from Green Space Alliance (GSA) met in April. All went well. Judith Temple gave a synopsis of the history of the JCG. We discussed the need to determine if the water leak in the garden had been repaired and the measures that needed to be taken to ensure the leak is fixed.

Jennifer Alaniz, Community Facilitator of the Cielo International Community Garden, provided information about the organization which helps refugees from many countries locate gardens to grow vegetables. There are several community gardens in the city which are prime examples of their hard labor. Suggestions were made to develop a partnership with CIELO to help bring back the JCG. Approval from the neighboring residents on W. Gramercy would be needed before we could get started.

There was a discussion on possibly having a second steward for the JCG. Caroline Gonzalez Attwood volunteered for the position of stewardship, but since SAISD had already designated Chris Sherrill as the current steward for SAISD, we would ask that there be two stewards, one for SAISD and the other for the community.

Jefferson principal Mr. Orlando Vera and Mr. Chris Sherrill could not attend the April Meeting. We have asked to hold the next meeting at TJHS, making it more convenient for principal Vera and Jeff Teacher Chris Sherrill.

Recently, Jennifer Alaniz, Community Facilitator from CIELO International Community Garden, has found another garden for the refugees to grow their vegetables and the concerns about a water leak have been resolved.

The JCG Committee is waiting to hear from Principal Vera who reported he wants to have the next JCG meeting immediately after school ends. The date, time, and location will be posted on Facebook. 
