#### **Deed Restrictions**

After Harvey, many residents were and are still cleaning up and getting their property back in order, and have done terrific jobs doing so. But now, after surveying the community recently, we have found it necessary to remind residents that "DEED RESTRICTIONS" AND "CITY ORDINANCES," are still enforced in Gulf Meadows.

#### REMINDERS:

- 1. Do not park on the grass.
- Do not store broken down vehicles on the side of the house and driveway. We ask that you store them in the garage.
- Park all trailers on the driveway, in the garage, and/or if the trailer is parked on the street, it must be attached to a vehicle.
- Trailers parked on the driveway cannot be used as storage for trash or junk.
- 5. Cars on flat cannot stay parked on the street. Remove or fix the flat.
- Cars with no license tags and/or expired tags parked on the street will be reported to the city.
- Keep your front and back yards mowed and edged.
- 8. Do not store junk on the sides of home.
- Eighteen wheeler cabs are not allowed in the community at all! NO PARKING!
- 10. Job related heavy duty equipment vehicles are not allowed in the community. NO PARKING!

As always, the civic club is working to keep our neighborhood a place where you like living and calling it home.


