Imagine a Day Without Water: October 10th, 2018

Imagine: No water to drink, or even to make coffee with. No water to shower, flush the toilet, or do laundry. Hospitals would close without water. Firefighters couldn't put out those huge fires and farmers couldn't water their crops. Imagine a Day Without Water 2018 is the fourth annual day to raise awareness and educate America about the value of water. Last year, October



12, 2017, 750 organizations came together for Imagine a Day Without Water, the third annual day of action hosted by the Value of Water Campaign that asks Americans and our elected leaders to think about our often-overlooked water systems. Across the country, municipal water agencies, city halls, coffee shops, breweries, schools, nonprofits and more hosted events in their communities, called on their elected officials, and engaged their networks on social media-all in the

name of valuing water! We often take our invisible water and wastewater systems for granted. We turn on the tap and water comes out. We flush the toilet, and it goes away. It's often out of sight and out of mind. But, disasters like Hurricanes Maria, Irene, and Harvey, and crises like what happened in Flint, Michigan, shine a bright light on what it would be like to live without safe and reliable water and wastewater services. During Imagine a Day Without Water, millions of Americans participated in raising awareness about the value of water and the need to invest in water infrastructure so no communities have to imagine—or live—a day without water again.

We've seen a recent increase of criminals breaking into vehicles near trail-heads in Jefferson County and then quickly using the stolen credit cards at nearby King Soopers. Though some of these crooks are doing the typical smash the window and grab any bags in view, others are being craftier by prying open the windows, reaching in to unlock the door and then stealing the credit cards before putting the purses and wallets back so that often times the victims don't realize until later that anything has been stolen. The couple pictured in this video was seen using one of the stolen credit cards to buy several Visa gift cards as well as other items totaling more than \$5,000. 
CWCA Holiday Lighting/Decorating Contest

Republic Trash Services in Columbine West

Last month the CWCA received this letter from concerned residents. We have since researched and provided information from Republic. Thank you CW residents for contacting us and asking for clarification.

"Good Afternoon CWCA Board Members,

The mission of the Columbine West Civic Association (CWCA) is to "Promote neighborhood beautification and harmony through covenant enforcement, community based services, and social activities." Several years ago the board of CWCA negotiated a community based service for trash removal through Republic Services to secure a reasonable and fair rate of \$36 per quarter for one container of trash removal for a homeowner in CWCA. Effective 8/1/18, Republic notified us the rate will increase to \$48 per quarter, an unreasonable increase of 33% for the same continued service! Republic also increased their Environmental Fee from \$5.40 to \$7.20, a 33% increase. We contacted Republic Services to inquire if this large increase was an error. During our attempt to negotiate a reduction of the new rate with the supervisor at Republic Service, Frannie, advised us the quarterly rate of \$48, plus the \$7.20 Environmental Fee is for all customers in the Columbine West subdivision, no exceptions, no negotiations, because the "new rate was negotiated by CWCA". We were precluded from negotiating a price on our own behalf for our trash removal from Republic due to CWCA's agreement. We believe the CWCA negotiator did not act in the best interest of the CWCA community by negotiating for a 33% increase for

trash removal services without seeking competitive bids from other services to ensure every advantage was realized at the negotiation table, as good business practices would dictate. Additionally, we are concerned no notice was published in the CWCA Newsletter about CWCA's negotiation on behalf of all the homeowners which resulted in "increased fees" for trash removal services. We have since cancelled our trash removal services from Republic Services on 7/31/18. We secured trash removal services from Lies Waste Services (LWS) at a slightly lower rate than CWCA negotiated with Republic without having the benefit of negotiating leverage for multiple potential customers. Furthermore, the LWS Environmental Fee is \$3.00, less than half of Republic's Environmental Fee. Lies Waste Services' representative informed us they are open to discuss a reduced rate for those who live in Columbine West with CWCA - if CWCA has an interest to save money for its' homeowners in Columbine West. We are asking the board to contact Lies Waste Services at 303-286-6700 to negotiate a more reasonable price for the community-based service of trash removal on behalf of all homeowners in CWCA. We appreciate your consideration. Please keep us posted on the outcome of your negotiations with LWS. Thank you. Respectfully, Louis & Diane Richter - CW homeowners since 1978"

and representatives here in Denver and at customer service, I have found the following:

- We have encountered changes that have disallowed us to offer discounted pricing for what we call unorganized HOA's or communities.
- Each resident who has received a price increase has received increases that are uniform with our individual residential accounts.
- There was no negotiation with a representative from Columbine West on the new pricing. We are unsure where the customer service rep got that info, unless he/she made an assumption, that should not have been made.
- In order to receive the discounted pricing, the community would have to "organize" and be centrally billed to one party, either a board member or to a community management group.
- If the community would like to organize and be centrally billed, I can provide HOA pricing for the community and if the community approves we would provide service to the entire community and also provide bins to each member.

We apologize for the inconvenience that this has caused the community members. If they are interested in receiving a bid for services for central billing, please let me know and we can proceed. Thank you.

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The Columbine Kitchen

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Hello Columbine West & Happy October! With fall in the air, I always begin to pine early for ways to make the summer last just a little bit longer. A couple of months ago I froze a bunch of delicious Palisade Peaches and came up with the most unexpectedly delicious recipe for Colorado Spiced Peach Cobbler. The fresh peaches melt with spices like cardamom and cinnamon, lemon juice and honey. They are topped with a buttermilk honey oat pancake-batter biscuit topping; that is both sweet, slightly salty, perfectly crisp on the outside, and soft and pillowy inside. When the fruit and the crust combined, it made me feel like I was whisked away to a fragrant family orchard on the Western Slope on a lazy summer day in the sunshine. So as the weather begins to chill and fall turns into winter, I hope this cobbler will keep the light of Colorado's summer sunshine burning deep in your heart, and the positive vibes deep in your soul.

COLORADO SPICED PEACH COBBLER

Preheat oven to 375.

Ingredients:

Filling:

- Peaches (about 6 large peeled and cut into small pieces). *Schatz' Side Note: I highly recommend looking up YouTube videos on how to properly blanch then peel a peach. It makes the entire process easier
- Sugar (1/2 cup)
- Brown Sugar (1/2 cup)

- Spices: Cinnamon, Nutmeg, Ginger, Cloves, Cardamom, Allspice. *Schatz' Side Note: You don't want to over-spice this dish. The amount total of spices should only need to be about 1/4-1/2 tsp total. Remember you can always add more, but cannot take away. This recipie really calls for the cook to gauge it to their own tastes and needs.
- Vanilla (splash)
- Corn Starch (about 1 tbsp) *Schatz' Side Note: Cornstarch is important as it thickens to a beautiful pie filling like consistency after so don't forget this step!

Mix all ingredients in a large bowl checking for taste constantly. Pour filling into well greased large glass baking pan. *Schatz' Side Note: You can also wait and put half the dough down in the pan first, then adding the peach filling and topping it with the other half.

Topping:

- Kodiak Cakes Buttermilk Honey Pancake Mix (approx 2 cups) *Schatz' Side Note: Kodiak Cakes have extra protein in them which is great for my family. One of the biggest obstacles we have had adopting a vegetarian lifestyle is to get adequate protein. We found these on Reddit a few years ago when we tried the Keto diet, and have loved them ever since!
- Water (enough to make pancake mix wet and into a dough)
- 3/4 stick cold butter

- Honey (to drizzle on top)
- Oats (approx 1/4 cup to top)
 Cut butter into dry pancake mix until finely crumbled. Add

enough water to make dough wet and like a soft dough. Drop dough by the spoonful on top of the fruit filling (see my precious side note above). Sprinkle with oats, drizzle with honey. Bake for approx 30-35 min. or until golden brown. Let cool at least 20 min. Serve with the most decadent vanilla ice cream possible and enjoy life! Tried this? Have a recipe you want me to try? Is Your Dog a Barker?

Columbine West voice mail line has had a number of reports from the neighborhood on the topic of barking dogs. The Civic Association does not have any rules governing this area, but we can make available some information including phone numbers and websites to forward you to. The Jeffco Animal Control Section provides quality enforcement pertaining to public safety, animal control and animal welfare. Their animal control officers are highly trained, experienced, certified professionals, who are also commissioned as agents for the Department of Agriculture, Bureau of Animal Protection. Officers investigate animal abuse and respond to a variety of citizen requests for service. Services include: leash law enforcement, regulating barking dogs, regulating vicious/dangerous dogs, dog licensing, rabies control, bite quarantines and courtesy dead animal removal. Animal control officers cover 524 square miles of unincorporated Jefferson County. The Animal Control Section falls within the Patrol Division of the Jefferson County Sheriff's Office. This partnership began in January 1998 as a result of a county reorganization. Staff is comprised of a department manager, officers, dispatchers and administrative personnel.
