Did You Know?

- Everyone's water bill is high. Here are some facts about water usage:
- Dishwashers on average use 6 gallons of water per cycle, while Energy Star dishwashers use 4 gallons.
- Toilets built before 1982 use 5 to 7 gallons every flush. Newer toilets use 1.6 gallons every flush.
- Standard washing machines use about 23 gallons of water per load. Older washing machines use 40-50 gallons per load.
- The average family of 4 uses 400 gallons of water a day.

Are You An Effective Witness?

Imagine a scenario that, unfortunately, could happen to any resident of Lincoln Village. You are cooking dinner in your home, watching the vegetables fry like any evening, when suddenly you hear the familiar beep of your car alarm. You rush outside to see your passenger window broken, shards of glass scattered on the street and curb. Inside, your items are ransacked, and even your work laptop case has been taken. Looking down the street, you see your bag being carried by a person sprinting away.

Is it a man or woman? What are they wearing? Is it important to know what they're wearing? Or should you have focused on the color of their hair first?

As you can see, this very real situation could happen to any of us, and the answers to these questions may very well determine whether law enforcement can get your bag back to you, or apprehend the suspect. The Greater Lincoln Village Area Block Watch is holding its third annual Effective Witness Program on Wednesday, October 24 at 6:30pm at the Prairie Township Fire Department, 123 Inah Avenue, for this very purpose. This informational program is put together for free by the Franklin County Sheriff's Office, and will provide you with the tips and tools you need to become an effective witness. The hope is that you'll never need to use these skills, but in the unfortunate event something happens, you will be fully prepared and know exactly what to proactively do. It will make you sleep easier at night, knowing that you and your neighbors have the tools to assist law enforcement if the need ever arises.

In other news, we want to give a big THANK YOU to everyone that attended our second annual National

Night Out in August! Our turnout in terms of residents and businesses more than doubled from 2017, and we even had participation from the schools this year. What's "in" for Fall 2018



Memories of National Night Out



Prairie Township's Do Not Knock Registry

You can now place your address on the Do Not Knock Registry. Once your address is on the registry, the Township will send you a sticker that must be displayed on or near your front door or window. If you sign up for this registry and display the sticker, all people going door to door are prohibited from knocking on your door.

This registry excludes those representing any entity exempt from taxation under Section 5709.04 of the Ohio Revised Code (i.e. students selling items for school fundraisers, Boy/Girl Scouts, etc.) The Do Not Knock Registry does not apply to any person going door to door, that you personally invite onto your property.
