9Health Fair Is 40 Years Old

Colorado's 9 Health Fair program; is celebrating its 40th Anniversary this year. Also you can wish Columbine United Church's 9Health Fair a Happy 20th Anniversary.

9HealthFair is coming again to Columbine United Church, 6375 S. Platte Canyon Road. The fair will be held Saturday April 13, 2019 from 7:00 to noon. The Chemistry Panel, PSA, Vitamin D, Hemoglobin A1C, and Blood Cell count are being offered as well as Testosterone and Vitamin B12. New this year will be High Sensitivity-CRP (help measure your risk of developing cardiovascular disease), and Blood Type. The blood tests and the Colon Cancer screening test are the only items that will cost anything. All the other tests and screenings are free, including: Height, Weight and BMI, Vision checks, Oral exams, Blood Pressure, Breast, Skin, Stress Management, and Pulmonary Function. There will also be informational areas on various health issues.

The 9HealthFair website, www.9HealthFair.org will become active early February for anyone to register to participate or volunteer. Volunteers are rewarded with a 20% discount on Lab tests. 9Health Fair's main purpose is: "promoting health awareness and encouraging individuals to assume responsibility for their health." 



The association received an anonymous letter last month and there were a few questions we would like to answer the letter writer and the community on whole. The first question follows. (3 part) "What has happened to CWCA and Columbine West? Where is our Christmas spirit? & Where are our entrance decorations?" The letter mentioned the lack of entrance signs being draped with garland, bows and wreaths this Christmas season. "We do have Christmas spirit in CWCA. Our volunteers who previously installed the entrance decorations, for the past 3 years, moved away in late Fall. We didn't have any other Officers/ Board members with available time. Our Board members and volunteers are few in number and overworked, so asking one of them to take on another task is unfair. We are always asking for new volunteers, either through the newsletter or Nextdoor.com, to help with tasks around the neighborhood. The Officers/Board care deeply for the neighborhood and put their hands to work as their own personal lives and schedules allow.



All new wood-burning stoves and fireplaces installed in Jefferson County must meet stringent Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) emission standards. During high pollution days (red days), no wood-burning is allowed below 7,000 feet elevation, except by using EPA Phase III stoves, approved pellet stoves or approved masonry heaters. Complaints about wood-burning during high pollution days should be directed to your city officials (usually the zoning department). If you live in unincorporated areas of Jefferson County, call the Planning and Zoning Department at 303-271-8700.
