NEW- After quite a bit of research, we are changing pool hours to open at 1:30 pm. Our sign in sheets from the last 3 years show the majority of folks do not get to the pool till right around 2:00pm but then it starts hopping! It will save a bit of money each week to not pay a Gatekeeper or Lifeguard to sit at an empty pool. Thank you for understanding. By the way.....WE ARE LOOKING FOR LIFEGUARDS. Please have them contact us for an application.

As always, you may text or call me (Sandra) or Kelly Adame for pool related questions. We both work and can't always answer right away. Just leave a message and allow us some time (24 to 48 hours) to get back to you. We promise we will! Also, please **like us on Facebook @El Dorado Homes Association.** Special pool news, events, weather related updates, and such are posted there. If the weather is looking sketching, check FB before heading to the pool. We will post updates often. It's a tricky call sometimes but safety is the priority. 



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Nix Excuses

Stop Making These 5 Excuses if You Want to Return to School

If you're debating whether returning to school as an adult is really worth it, these 5 solutions to the most common excuses will have you ready to enroll. But if you're serious about continuing your education and developing yourself professionally, it's time to see those so-called reasons for what they really are- excuses. The good news is that with the right approach, you can overcome each and every one of these excuses.

Excuse: School will burn a hole in my wallet

Solution: Think of it as an investment that pays back tenfold

Money concerns are a formidable barrier if you're thinking about returning to school. When your budget is already tight, it can be difficult to justify spending even more on school fees. However, your education is one of the few investments you can make that will improve your future. You've probably heard the saying, "you have to spend money to make money", and education is the prime example. There is a clear correlation between obtaining further education and earning a higher income. Better qualifications open the door to more professional opportunities, and in turn, more earning capacity. The bottom line is that going back to school pays off.

Excuse: I can't produce money I don't have out of thin air Solution: Shop around for an affordable course and make use of financial aid

"Alright," I hear you now say. "That all sounds peachy, but how do you suppose I'll even afford to fund my studies in the first place?" There are in fact numerous ways you can make it work financially. Search around and you'll find many colleges which offer relatively affordable degrees. Another major advantage to completing an online degree is that there are no face-to-face contact hours. No one will know if you're tapping away on your computer in your pajamas at home, or on your daily commute to work. Explore your options to find one that suits your particular financial and life situation.

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Excuse: I'm not sure if my employer will value my Degree Solution: Prove them wrong

You're worried that despite all your efforts to earn a degree, your employer won't take it seriously because it comes from a non-lvy League or lesser known college. It's understandable that you'd want your current or future employer to be impressed with your sparkling new degree, and for it to lead to new opportunities for promotion and greater earnings. Who says it won't? An increase in interest and enrollment numbers has led career colleges and online universities to continually improve the quality of their courses. Many degrees have improved to the extent that they're now of a comparable quality to those of traditional colleges. As such, the stigma from attending a career college or online degree has dramatically decreased, and continues to do so. "When you think about balancing a job and the needs of a family with school, that says a lot about the discipline of a person," says Susan Fontana, regional vice president of global recruiting firm, Manpower. "I think 10 years ago, you probably had a little more questioning, but it really is so much more accepted today." This positive change in the way online degrees are viewed is backed by recent research. The majority of employers will be impressed by your determination to learn and will appreciate the fresh contributions and perspectives you can make to the company. Moreover, obtaining a degree relevant to your field will allow you to meet the increasing demand by employers for employees to be proactively upskilling themselves. Being competitive in the job market is vital not only in the search for a promotion or new job, but also to maintain your current role. Any reasonable employer will recognize a degree for what it is- a representation of the hours of study you underwent to boost your knowledge, learn new skills, and bolster yourself professionally. It's time to stop underestimating how valuable your degree will be seen in the eyes of employers.

Excuse: I don't want to be seen as the token older student Solution: Stop caring what others think and start seeing your age and experience as an asset

You're anxious that if you head back to school, your peers will stereotype you once they see you're not fresh out of high school like them; that you'll stick out like a Billy Madison-style caricature just because you're older than the average student. Well, take a look at these stats. Enrollment numbers of older students are sizable and are projected to continue growing, so your fears are unfounded. Enrollment in postsecondary degree-granting institutions of students who are 35 years old and over increased 26% between 1997 and 2011, and it's projected that this will increase by a further 23% between 2011 and 2022. There's no shame in going back to school. Don't let immature people dissuade you from fulfilling your dream of completing your education. If you do so, the only person whose happiness and growth will suffer is your own. Instead, take a more productive approach and harness your age and experience to further your studies. People who return to school later in life bring with them years of invaluable professional and personal experience and knowledge. Don't see your experiences as a negative, use them to improve your coursework and interactions with your peers. Many colleges even account for your professional experience with credits that may allow for your workload to be reduced, or even for you to fasttrack your degree. Inquire with your chosen institution how you can use your experience to your advantage.

When you find yourself slipping back to questioning if it's worth all the effort, keep your eye on your goal and remind yourself what going back will mean for you, your family, and your future. Rarely do the things we really want come to us easily. Be prepared to work hard and you'll be rewarded. People rarely regret achieving further education, so if you want it, find a way to make it work.

So what are you waiting for?

If you're reading this article, you're feeling motivated. Take action now, and nip those excuses in the bud. Use this opportunity to search for a school that will work with your busy schedule, and give you the flexibility and affordability you need to earn that degree.

Did you know that you can download NextDoor.com as an app on your smartphone? It's easy to set up an account once you download the app from your preferred provider.



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


When are They Going to Fix My Street?

The San Antonio City Council recently approved the 2018 city budget using the "equity lens" proposed by Mayor Nirenberg and implemented by City Manager Scully. As part of this new budget allocation, District 10 received additional money over and above its usual allotment for road repairs. This allowed our council office to request that certain roads be moved up on the repair schedule. Most of El Dorado was originally included in the 2022-2025 maintenance window, but about seventy five percent of our streets are now in the 2018-2021 cycle.

Because other projects have been moved forward due to the increased funding in the equity lense budget, the following El Dorado streets are now slated for repaving in 2019: Camino Dorado, Casa Loma, El Gusto, El Presidio, La Aventura, and Risada. For 2020, we have: Del Oro Circle, El Cajon, El Domingo, El Sendero, Estable, La Bahia, La Barranca, La Entrada, La Noche, La Plata, La Posada, La Salida, Las Brisas, Loma Grande, Prima Vista, Sierra Madre, and Via Perfecto. In 2021, the following streets will be repaved: El Arroyo, El Sueno, Encanta, Gran Vista, La Charca, La Cienga, La Manana, Las Nubes, Linda Colonia, Los Cerdos, and Los Palacias. All of our other streets will remain on the 2022-2025 schedule: Cerro Vista, El Largo, El Palacio, El Tejano, La Albada, La Bodega, La Lira, La Pradera, La Senda, Los Campos, Madrigal, and Magnifico.

The EDHA Board is working with representatives of the Councilman's office and TCI to try to move Prima Vista into the 2019 program. Please let your area representative know if you have any questions.
