


Shiloh House Easter Baskets

To Bag or Not To Bag

Buy. Fill. Gone. Maybe you have seen the display at your local home improvement store. For right around thirty dollars you too can have a mini-dumpster to help with your kitchen or bathroom remodel. Perhaps you have some larger items to dispose that just won't fit into your trash can. The Bagster can be a great option. When it comes to enforcing covenants the CWCA Covenant Control Group (CCG) tends to be understanding when residents require a dumpster or bagster for a specific purpose, such as a remodel, even though Covenant C-10 expressly states "No lot shall be used or maintained as a dumping ground for rubbish". C-10 goes on to say that trash shall be kept in sanitary containers and those containers shall be kept within a building or enclosure. The CWCA has further clarified that proper storage can be behind a fence or in a garage so the container is hidden from view. The CCG understands a dumpster or bagster is too large to be easily hidden from view and so requests that anyone needing a dumpster/bagster please contact CWCA before acquiring the dumpster/bagster with information regarding dumpster/bagster arrival and removal dates (CWCAtalk@gmail.com or 303-904-8218). The CCG is starting to see some residents leaving full bagsters in their driveways or yard for extended periods of time, sometimes many months, with no sign of use. Residents are reminded these containers are considered rubbish by our covenants and either must be removed, stored behind a fence or in the garage. Residents storing bagsters in their front yards will receive a C-10 violation "First Notice Letter" from the CCG unless an arrangement to temporarily store the bagster has been made and the bagster is removed at the agreed upon date. Please help up keep our beautiful neighborhood clean and attractive for all our residents.
