Bulk Trash Advisory!!

There will be no bulk trash pickup in May and June! Bulk trash collection is a quarterly service provided by the **Phoenix Public Works Department** as part of your residential trash and recycling service. Bulk trash consists of materials that are too large to fit in the garbage or recycling container. Materials such as furniture, large appliances and large amounts of vegetation are often considered bulk trash.

Things To DO:

- ◆ Follow the dates for bulk trash placement. Sweep or rake area after collection, if necessary Securely bag or box all grass, leaves, weeds, twigs, and hedge clippings before placing out for bulk trash
- ◆ Make sure all tree trunks or stumps are cut down to sizes smaller than 12" in diameter

Do NOT Include:

- ◆ More than 20 cubic yards in your pile per residence
- ◆ A pile the size of a SUV Loose grass, leaves, weeds, twigs etc..
- ◆ Household hazardous waste (HHW), such as antifreeze, pool chemicals, oil, batteries, paint, tires, and any shape or size Appliances that use refrigerants

Phoenix New Mayor Kate Gallego

On March 12, former city Councilwoman Kate Gallego was elected Mayor of the city of Phoenix. She is only the second woman to be elected to the job; and only the third woman to ever serve in the role as Mayor of the nation's fifth largest city. Mayor Gallego stated, "I'm beyond excited to be back at the city of Phoenix and have already begun working on improving education, creating more jobs, safer neighborhoods and on investing in our city's infrastructure." An inauguration ceremony was held on Thursday, March 21 inside the city's iconic Orpheum Theatre. Mayor Gallego was elected in a Special Election to fill the vacancy left behind by now-Congressman Greg Stanton. She will serve out the remainder of his term, which ends in April of 2021.

Do You Live in a Flood Hazard Zone? Is your home or business in a Special Flood Hazard Area (SFHA)? If so, you may want to consider purchasing flood insurance. You may also apply for flood insurance even if you are not in a SFHA to reduce the cost of damages caused by localized flooding. To find out if there is an elevation certificate on file for your property, which calculates your flood insurance policy risk, or to see if your property is in a SFHA, call 602-262-4960 or visit Floodplain Management at Phoenix City Hall, 200 West Washington Street, 5th Floor, Phoenix, AZ, 85003. In addition to flood insurance, you can make a list of personal property, take photos of your property to assist your insurance adjuster and keep all important information and electronics in a safe and dry place. Healthy Home Tip: Time for a Breath of Fresh Air

Did you know that the air inside your home can be harmful to your family's health? Air can be unhealthy if it has too many pollutants. Sometimes indoor air pollutants come from what people do in their homes like smoking, crafts and hobbies, or the use of harsh cleaners. Other times, indoor air pollutants come from what people have in their homes like pets, carbon monoxide, or lead based paint.

Being exposed to pollutants may lead to immediate reactions like irritations of the eyes, nose and throat, headaches, dizziness and fatigue. Repeated or long-term exposure to some pollutants can lead to respiratory disease, heart problems, brain damage, and death. What can you do to improve indoor air quality in your home? The U.S. department of Housing and Urban Development recommends that you keep your home well ventilated and contaminant free. Any crafts or hobbies that require chemicals like staining, painting and so on should be done in the garage or in a room that can be aired out after completion of projects.

Keep it Well Ventilated:

- ◆ Ventilate bathrooms, kitchens and places where moisture is present to prevent mold growth.
- ◆ Keep central heating and A/C equipment clean
- ◆ Use whole house ventilation to supply fresh air and reduce the concentration of contaminants.
- ◆ Make sure fuel burning appliances are working correctly and are vented to the outside of your home.

Keep it Contaminant Free:

- ◆ Follow the instructions when using household chemicals and cleaners
- ◆ Reduce dust by cleaning often and reduce clutter
- ◆ Smoke outside and away from children
- ◆ Place carbon monoxide alarms near sleeping areas

Evidence shows that a well-maintained home that is kept clean, safe, dry, pest free, well ventilated, contaminate free and in good repair contributes to good health and a safer environment for everyone. Summer Chicken Salad

Ingredients

5 slices bacon chopped
 2 tablespoons minced green onion
 1 tablespoons chopped parsley
 3 cups cubed chicken cooked
 1 cup chopped tomato
 2 stalks celery sliced
 3/4 cups mayo
 1 large Avocado sliced
 1 teaspoon lemon juice
 1 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
 12 leaves Romaine lettuce
 Salt and black Pepper to taste

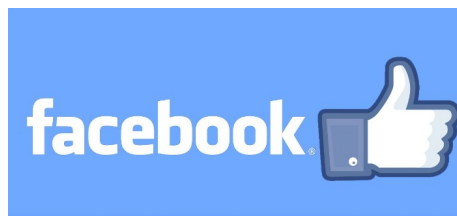
Directions

Prep time is 15 minutes. Cook time is 15 minutes. Salad is ready in 1 hour.

1. Place bacon in a large skillet and cook over medium-high heat, turning occasionally, until evenly browned, about 10 minutes. Drain bacon slices on paper towels; crumble.
2. Stir chicken, bacon, tomato, and celery together in a bowl.
3. Whisk mayonnaise, parsley, green onions, lemon juice, Worcestershire sauce, salt, and black pepper together in a bowl until dressing is smooth. Pour dressing over chicken mixture; toss to coat. Refrigerate until chilled, at least 30 minutes.
4. Stir chicken mixture and serve over romaine lettuce leaves; garnish with avocado slices.
