## **El Dorado Community Garden**

## After a grueling summer, mulch is the perfect topper for your tired landscape.

At its best, mulch provides nutrients — especially carbon, nature's workhorse — to the soil. It also increases soil structure, reduces soil moisture loss, reduces soil temperatures and reduces plant competition so roots can grow quickly and farther.

Mulch is the general term for two types of products: inorganic and organic mulch.

Inorganic products include decomposed granite, small river rock, rubber pellets and black plastic. Although they reduce soil moisture loss and temperatures beneath the soil surface, they hardly provide any environmental benefits. Certainly, river rock absorbs heat during the day and creates mini-heat islands next to the house during the night. Yikes! As if we don't have enough heat at night during July and August.

On the other hand, organic mulches such as woodchips, pine bark, pecan shell, pine needles, straw and live oak leaves provide carbon and nitrogen as well as reduce moisture loss, soil temperatures and plant competition. Conversely, they do not absorb heat during the day.

The depth of application for all mulches is 1-2 inches. Ideally, we first apply ½ inch of quality compost and then add ½ to 1 inch of mulch. This is exactly like nature does it and one can't improve upon nature. When more than 2 inches are applied, we run the risk of watering the mulch and not the soil.

As students head back to school, it's particularly important to obey traffic laws and drive safely in school zones. School zones are put in place to ensure the safety of children in and around schools. While class is in session, drivers are responsible for maintain-

- Yield to pedestrians at all intersections, whether marked with a crosswalk or not, it's the law.
- Look both ways for pedestrians and bicyclists when turning right on a red light.
- Be aware of students where there are no sidewalks along the road and when backing out of driveways.
- Watch for younger and less predictable children who may dart into the road.
- Stop and wait for school buses when red lights are flashing.

The 311SA Mobile App allows you to interact with the City of San Antonio by submitting service requests for concerns that need attention, while earning rewards, strengthening communities and empowering local businesses. City services available through the app include requests for pothole repair, graffiti removal, animal and property maintenance concerns, as well as many more.

Through the app, citizens are able to flag (geolocate a service request), attach a photo, and provide supporting information for issues throughout your community. The requests go straight to the appropriate City department for evaluation and investigation.


The 311SA Mobile App also has a social network feature, which allows sharing and voting on other users flags/requests.

## When are They Going to Fix My Street?

The San Antonio City Council recently approved the 2018 city budget using the "equity lens" proposed by Mayor Nirenberg and implemented by City Manager Scully. As part of this new budget allocation, District 10 received additional money over and above its usual allotment for road repairs. This allowed our council office to request that certain roads be moved up on the repair schedule. Most of El Dorado was originally included in the 2022-2025 maintenance window, but about seventy five percent of our streets are now in the 2018-2021 cycle.

Because other projects have been moved forward due to the increased funding in the equity lense budget, the following El Dorado streets are now slated for repaving in 2019: Camino Dorado, Casa Loma, El Gusto, El Presidio, La Aventura, and Risada. For 2020, we have: Del Oro Circle, El Cajon, El Domingo, El Sendero, Estable, La Bahia, La Barranca, La Entrada, La Noche, La Plata, La Posada, La Salida, Las Brisas, Loma Grande, Prima Vista, Sierra Madre, and Via Perfecto. In 2021, the following streets will be repaved: El Arroyo, El Sueno, Encanta, Gran Vista, La Charca, La Cienga, La Manana, Las Nubes, Linda Colonia, Los Cerdos, and Los Palacias. All of our other streets will remain on the 2022-2025 schedule: Cerro Vista, El Largo, El Palacio, El Tejano, La Albada, La Bodega, La Lira, La Pradera, La Senda, Los Campos, Madrigal, and Magnifico.

The EDHA Board is working with representatives of the Councilman's office and TCI to try to move Prima Vista into the 2019 program. Please let your area representative know if you have any questions.
