City Right-of-Way

DO

- Keep Right-of-Way clear. They are used for public passage and for the installation of curbs, sidewalks and utilities.
- Keep Rights-of-Way free of obstructions including, overhanging tree limbs and other plants that impede the passage of vehicular and pedestrian traffic.
- Contact the Development Services, Code Enforcement Section, if you have any questions about what is allowed on a City Right-of-Way.

DON'T

- Store any obstructions such as recreational equipment (swing sets, basketball goals, etc.) on City Right-of-Way.
- Build anything on City Right-of-Way without prior approval.
- Don't trim any tree limbs near power lines; instead, contact CPS Energy tree trimming service.
 - Ignore a notice of violation from the City.
 - Park a vehicle in an alleyway.
- Park over the curb line or block the sidewalk with your vehicle.



Gas Leaks: Recognize, React, Report

1. RECOGNIZE THE SIGNS OF A GAS LEAK

- Smell: A distinctive, sulfur-like odor. Not all gas is odorized, so do not rely on your nose alone to detect a leak.
- Sight: Continuous bubbling in water outdoors, dirt spraying or blowing into the air, or dead/dying vegetation in an otherwise moist area.
- Sound: Hissing, roaring or whistling noises coming from the ground or gas equipment.

2. REACT IMMEDIATELY IF YOU SUSPECT A LEAK.

Assume there's a danger. Warn others and leave the area quickly. Do NOT light a match or use electrical appliances including light switches, garage door openers, doorbells, radios, TVs or any phone. These items can ignite natural gas.

3. REPORT THE LEAK

From a safe location, call CPS Energy's gas emergency number at 210a-353-HELP (4357) and dial 911. Do NOT assume someone else will report the leak. Stay far away from the leak area until our personnel say it is safe to return.


