September is a good time for Arizona residents to ensure they are taking all necessary precautions and measures to combat the preventable tragedy of drowning. Drowning prevention takes a village. We must all take responsibility for anyone around water. With summer to-do lists and Labor Day distractions, this month marks an especially dangerous time of year. Keep your family safe by following these tips:

- Remove phones, tablets, TVs and other electronic distractions from around the pool.
- Designate pool supervisors and have them take turns being on watch.
- Purchase approved lifesaving devices, such as life jackets, and stow them around water.
- Don't leave furniture or toys near a pool fence. Children may be tempted to climb them.
- Check all door and window locks. Dog doors too. Leave nothing open that leads to a pool.

Ban on Dark Campaign Money has been Implemented

It's been over eight months since Phoenix voters overwhelmingly approved a ban on so -called dark money in local campaigns. Phoenix Mayor Kate Gallego announced the ban went into effect in July, it's been under legal review by the governor's office since it passed in November. Mayor Gallego hailed the move as momentous for the city that truly had bipartisan support.

Voters approved this proposition with 85% support. That is overwhelming numbers that makes it about as popular as chocolate ice cream. Everyone is really excited to see that voters across party lines, across ages, agree we want open and transparent elections. The Mayor says this is personal to her and she hopes the effects of the ban will be felt in future city elections. She is really hopeful that it will be a more positive election with people being more accurate if they have to put their name on it. There is a real need to be accountable to what you're saying. She was attacked with dark money from people who actually agreed with the stance they were attacking her for.

The Mayor believes voters need to know that and know it's pure politics and not really people who care about the issues. She is very optimistic that we'll have more positive factbased elections in the city of Phoenix going forward.

North Glen Kitchen



Crispy Chicken with Peaches & Plums

Ingredients

8 skin-on, bone-in chicken thighs (about 3 pounds), excess fat trimmed

Kosher salt and freshly ground pepper

- 1 lemon
- 3 small shallots
- 3 cloves garlic
- 2 peaches
- 2 plums
- 1 tablespoon honey
- 3 sprigs thyme, plus 1 teaspoon thyme leaves

Directions

Preheat the oven to 450°. Pat the chicken dry with paper towels and season generously with salt and pepper. Arrange skin-side down in a large ovenproof skillet (the chicken will be snug) and place over medium-high heat on your cooktop. Cook until the chicken skin is sizzling, about 5 minutes. Reduce the heat to medium and cook until the skin is very browned and crisp, 8 to 10 minutes (reduce the heat slightly if the chicken is browning too quickly). Transfer the chicken skin-side up to a plate; reserve the skillet.

Meanwhile, remove the lemon zest in wide strips using a vegetable peeler, then juice the lemon. Trim and quarter the shallots. Smash the garlic. Cut the peaches and plums into 3/4-inch-thick wedges. Discard all but about 1 tablespoon fat from the skillet. Add the lemon zest, shallots and garlic and cook, stirring, until softened, 2 minutes. Add the lemon juice, scraping up any bits from the bottom of the skillet. Add the peaches, plums, honey and thyme sprigs, season with salt and pepper and stir to combine.

Place the chicken, skin-side up, on top of the fruit and transfer the skillet to the oven. Roast until the chicken is cooked through and the fruit is soft and bubbling, about 15 minutes. Discard the thyme sprigs. Divide among plates and top with the thyme leaves. Enjoy!
