It is with heavy heart that the Cactus Park West Neighborhood Association board of Alyssa Glauber, Vicki and Guy Allen, Gloria Lamb, Diane Pedersen and Hank Leyva have decided to dissolve CPWNA. The members of our board have decided that it is time for us to focus on our families and other personal responsibilities that need our attention during these difficult times.

CPW in one form or another has been in existence for 28 years with the help of over 42 neighborhood volunteers who delivered the monthly newsletter. Looking at the last newsletter I could find on my computer from 2008, eight neighbors out of the 42 are still delivering the newsletter in 2020. Thanks to all the neighbors over the years who did this and thanks to the "old timers" which include the Currans, the Holbens, the Hausers, The Glaubers, Hank Leyva, Maureen Bayardi, Luella Kolb, Jeff Shortsleeve and Carol Glomski.

We have had almost three decades of newsletters, school and city partnerships, monthly meetings, thousands of volunteer hours, multiple neighborhood updates, and many neighborhood picnics and GAIN (Getting Arizona Involved in Neighborhoods) events. We are grateful to have been given the opportunity to make a positive impact in our community, along with having made many lasting friendships over the years.

We now feel that it is time for the neighborhood to turn to a new page, and it is up to you as the neighbors to decide what you want the next chapter to be. We know from experience that there are some pretty amazing people in this neighborhood, and we encourage you to continue to make this a community that supports and cares for one another.

Cactus Park West was started in 1992 by Don Gerard. Don lived on Poinsettia Street and was surrounded by five single moms. He kind of looked out for them helping them with repairs and such when they needed them. One Christmas one of these gals was burglarized and all her Christmas presents were stolen so she had nothing for her young son. This angered Don so much he called the Police Department and they suggested he start a neighborhood watch. About 50 neighbors showed up in his backyard and then Councilman Dave Seibert even showed up with his wife.

Don printed and paid for out of his pocket a one page newsletter and started with his street and the next block and with one advertiser. People were excited to help in the beginning, but then the help and excitement dwindled down over the years because people have busy lives. Alice and Billie Brandon were there from the start and helped Don with his endeavors for the neighborhood. In the mid 1990's Don got Bill Joswick to help him with the newsletter by having semi annual neighborhood yard sales where all the proceeds went to print the newsletter. Bill was also the treasurer for a long time. It was quite a thing to see all the neighbors give up their stuff in order to support the newsletter. We always had lots of people helping and it was nice to see.

My husband Guy and I came to the neighborhood in 1995 and started helping out. We started having the neighborhood picnic at Cactus Park to celebrate National Night Out to thank the police for their crime fighting efforts. We had free food, games and donated prizes. Ever the showman, Bill J. sang and brought his guitar for the entertainment. It was a lot of work that a handful of people did, but everyone had a good time over the years. Year after year the picnic got bigger and bigger with the help of the local schools.

The newsletter was expanded to over 2000 homes from 35th Ave to 43rd Ave, Cactus to Peoria and Alice & Billy Brandon took over the meetings in 2001 for a year or so and helped Don with the newsletter. Don continued with the newsletter until health problems forced him to move to Sun City. Around 2005 Dan Glauber a neighbor and owner of D & B Auto took over the chairmanship and I started writing the newsletter. His family, Betsy, Alyssa, Daniel and Brian had been involved for many years prior to him taking over.

For many years we paid for the newsletter with our local businesses who wanted to advertise. In 2008 Gloria Lamb started writing grants so we could get money from the City of Phoenix to pay for the newsletter and pay for community projects. Gloria took over the accounting from Bill J. in 2012 and noted that we have gotten city grants totaling **\$75K** over the years. Since then, CPW has been involved with more than 1000 students over the years for our neighborhood initiatives from Moon Valley HS, Tumbleweed Elementary and Cholla Middle School, and partnered with GPC, Graffiti Protective Coatings to combat graffiti in the neighborhood. The GAIN event was something we all looked forward to and was the pride of the area bringing in over 300 to 400 people each October. The local businesses gave away coupons and prizes and with the help of the school kids and MV NJROTC, the event was always great.

Dan Glauber passed away in 2015 and his daughter Alyssa Glauber took the torch as Chairwomen and carried us through since then. Since its founding CPWNA has given over \$1891 in support of schools and organizations via community involvement, music, awards, field trips and donations for their benefit and projects. Some of our accomplishments for the neighborhood were:

- $\Rightarrow$  A "Fight Back" award, where neighbors painted the walls one color along 43  $^{\rm rd}$  Ave & Cactus
- ⇒ We put up street lights at various spots in the neighborhood
- ⇒ The Keep Kids Alive, Drive 25 Campaign
- ⇒ Anti-Graffiti Over Sight Committee
- ⇒ Funding transportation for educational field trips at the school
- ⇒ Clean up drives in the neighborhood
- ⇒ Putting up new Neighborhood watch signs (Thank you Diane Pederson Family and others)
- ⇒ Partnered with Cholla Middle School for their Wake Up Program for 2 years
- ⇒ Getting bike paths and some speed bumps put in
- $\Rightarrow\,$  Don G. got a tree planted in the park for a beloved long time crossing guard that passed away
- ⇒ Don got a grant to put the playground equipment in at Cactus Park

None of this would have been possible without the support of our neighborhood volunteers, local school groups, our wonderful City of Phoenix police department, and city staff, Neighborhood Services and other officials. We thank you from the bottom of our hearts for all everyone has done for our community since the founding of CPWNA.

Taking an active role in your community is one of the best ways to reduce crime and keep our streets safe for our families. While CPWNA will no longer be in existence, there will continue to be many resources and opportunities for you to participate in community groups, such as CPCA.






# JULY 10 STATEMENT FROM COUNCILWOMAN WILLIAMS ON 2020 CENSUS

As of July 9, **59.9 percent** of households in Phoenix responded to the census, statewide 58.6 percent, and nationally 62.0 percent of households have responded. The district's most undercounted census tract is Deer Valley with just 44.6 percent of residents responding to the 2020 Census. A complete count is critical to determining how taxpayer dollars will be returned to their communities for the next decade. Undercounts literally translate to lost revenue for much needed programs in our community. Programs such as public safety planning, including police and fire stations; hospitals and healthcare; food assistance programs, help for the homeless; highway planning; construction; public transit; emergency management; education and Head start; school lunches; disaster response; housing assistance are all funded through census counts. Please take a moment to help your community for the next 10 years— complete your 2020 Census and encourage your neighbors to do the same.


