

**Daily Peace: 365 Days of Renewal: Photos and Wisdom to Nourish Your Spirit** published by National Geographic. I love the beautiful photographs and the fabulous selection of quotes that accompany them. Just taking a moment each day to enjoy them can help to calm the spirit. Here is just one of the quotes: "Always be on the watch for the coming of Wonders." (E. B. 
