


Holiday Lights Parade 2020

As Arizona experiences another spike in COVID-19 cases and COVID-related deaths are forecasted to increase in the coming month, we all have a responsibility to follow safety measures designed to keep our people healthy and stop community spread. This email contains information on concrete steps each of us can take to prevent further spread of the virus.

According to the <u>Centers for Disease</u> <u>Control (CDC)</u>, the most important actions to protect yourself and others from contracting the coronavirus are to wash your hands thoroughly and often, wear a cloth mask in public spaces, cover coughs and sneezes, disinfect commonly-touched surfaces, and maintain 6 feet of distance between yourself and others outside of your home. It is important to note that wearing a mask is not a substitute for social distancing- you should do both.

While wearing a mask in public spaces is not mandatory statewide in Arizona, widespread use <u>could make the difference</u> in the health and survival of many Arizonans. Many counties and municipalities do have mask requirements- check your local websites to stay informed.

The Arizona Department of Health's website has lots of helpful resources. They include: A <u>risk index</u> for common activities - know the chances you're taking before you go. Guidance for <u>how long to stay home</u> if you have COVID, and who your close contacts are.

Butternut Squash Soup

<u>Ingredients</u> – 4 servings 2 tablespoons butter, 1 small onion, 1 stalk celery, 1 medium carrot, 2 medium potatoes, 1 medium butternut squash – peeled, seeded and cubed, 1 32 oz container of chicken stock, salt and pepper to taste.

Step 1 – chop up all the veggies. Melt butter in large pot and cook the onion, celery, carrot, and squash for 5 minutes or until lightly browned. Pour in enough chicken stock to cover vegetables. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat to low, cover pot and simmer 40 minutes or until all vegetables are tender. Make sure to check the potatoes. They will take the longest to soften.

<u>Step 2</u> – Transfer the soup to a blender and blend until smooth. Return to the pot and mix any remaining stock to attain desired consistency. Season with salt and pepper. I like to add a little cinnamon as well but your choice.



Online Crime Reporting

Did you know that you can report crimes online? The system has been in place since 2013 however, many residents don't know it is available to use. It is a great tool when it is not an emergency and when you don't want to or need to speak to someone about the crime. There is criteria though on what can and cannot be reported. I have outlined them below for your convenience.

Online reports must meet the following criteria:

The incident must have occurred in Phoenix. You must have a valid email address. The value of lost or stolen property must not exceed \$10,000.00.

Online reports cannot be made for the following:

Crimes in progress, Vehicle accidents, Graffiti, Bias or hate crimes, Crimes in which the suspect is known by you or can be positively identified, Crimes involving stolen guns, vehicles, license plates or threats of harm, Residential or commercial burglaries.

Acceptable types of incidents for online reporting: Theft from a vehicle, Criminal damage, Fraudulent use of a credit/debit card, Lost property, Identity theft, Theft, Stolen bicycle, Harassing or nuisance phone calls, Theft from vending machines, Supplement additional information or property to an already existing online report.
