While it has not been customary to announce the passing of neighbors in the newsletter, an exception must be made in this instance. October saw the passing of two very long time residents of LEHHNA, Alyene Hayes and Gene Jernigan. Both were instrumental in what you are now familiar with as the Lake Eola Heights Historic District.

Alyene lived and raised her children in the neighborhood since the 1940s. Her community activism with children's groups and gardening were her passion. She gave special attention to her garden on the corner of Cathcart Avenue and Christor Place where you will find one of the largest collections of Florida native plants. She worked with our civic leaders to improve the quality of the neighborhood.

For those of you with a knowledge of Orlando's founding, you may recognize the name Jernigan as it was the original name of Orlando. Gene was a direct descendant of the founding family. While he spent his life between Orlando and South Georgia, he retired permanently in Lake Eola Heights. He was an ardent supporter of the preservation of the neighborhood and remained active in the association as his health permitted. It was not uncommon to catch Gene in the roundabout on Concord Street and Highland Avenue near his home changing light bulbs, trimming the landscape or picking up trash.

We owe both Alyene and Gene our appreciation for their unselfish commitment to community. They personify what makes Lake Eola Heights Historic District a great Orlando neighborhood.
