

Effective January 1, 2015, it is illegal to talk, text or otherwise handle a cell phone while driving a vehicle in San Antonio. The ordinance allows drivers to use cell phones — they just can't hold them. That means drivers must use other hands-free technology to engage in phone calls: Bluetooth, speakerphone or earbuds. The ordinance, however, doesn't prohibit still using the device to answer calls or place them. It also contains some exemptions, including those for on-duty public-safety personnel and drivers who are reporting illegal activity to a law-enforcement communicating "with agency, emergency response operator, a fire department, a law enforcement agency, a hospital, a physician's office, or a health clinic regarding a medical or other situation." emergency The council unanimously approved the ban implemented a 30-day grace period in which drivers will receive warnings.

My son Jadyn is a baseball player. Sure he plays other sports, and enjoys other activities, but he has a true love in his heart for the game of baseball. He has been playing at Capitol Park Little League since he was 4 years old, and he will turn 13 in March, right as the spring season is getting underway. Although I am a Baseball Mom through and through, I wanted to get a player's perspective, so I asked Jadyn some questions about playing at Capitol Park.

Me: How long have you been playing at Capitol Park?

Jadyn: 7 years (I guess math is not his strongest subject, as it will be nine years this spring)

Me: What is your favorite memory of Capitol Park?

Jadyn: Meeting Justin and Jason (two other boys he has played with for the past three years. I can totally

understand, as I have become good friends with their parents)

Me: What is the best thing about playing at Capitol Park?

Jadyn: Getting to pitch in big games

Me: How would you feel if you could no longer play at Capitol Park?

Jadyn: Really sad, because then I would have to make new friends, and prove myself to new coaches.

The last question I asked Jadyn may seem strange, but sometimes I worry about it becoming a reality. Unlike many baseball parks in the San Antonio area, Capitol Park is not a city park, and therefore gets no city funding. It runs strictly on registration fees of players and donations. Therefore we are always looking for donations, whether they are monetary, materials, or time. Albeit an older park, Capitol Park Little League is a great park to be involved with and we love it, and cannot imagine playing anywhere else. None of the coaches, board members, team moms etc. are paid, so you know they are doing everything they do for the love of the game and the kids... and trust me, they do A LOT! If you have a boy or girl between the ages of 4-17, bring them out and get them registered for baseball or softball. Capitol Park is the only American Little League baseball park that El Dorado falls within the boundaries of, so this is the place for you! If you have the time and love of the game, please consider volunteering as a coach, team mom, or just coming out to help at the park. We are always looking for more hands.

YOU'RE RIGHT!

WE NEED YOU.

Dear District 10 Residents,

I want to wish everyone a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year! Thank you to everyone who attended the District 10 Community Christmas Party.

Earlier this month, City Council took a significant step for improving the Northeast Corridor in our community. Council supported the creation of the Northeast Corridor Tax Increment Reinvestment Zone (TIRZ). This TIRZ will allow the City to invest in necessary infrastructure to help spur private investment along Perrin Beitel and Nacogdoches. When a developer makes improvements, property values increase. With the TIRZ, the taxes on the increase in property values will be set aside to pay for public improvements in the Northeast Corridor. This also means that the area will essentially invest in itself and help determine its future prosperity.

I have heard from several constituents regarding their concerns with airport noise and the Residential Acoustical Treatment Program (RATP). I want to assure everyone that I support quality of life for neighborhoods surrounding the airport. I recognize that there are homeowners that are unable to hold conversations in their homes or sleep through the night due to noise from aircraft.

The Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) recently began requiring airports to update their Noise Exposure Maps at least every 5 years in order to continue receiving federal funds for programs such as the RATP. The new noise maps designate fewer streets within several of our neighborhoods, leaving fewer residents the ability to obtain sound barring windows, doors, and insulation.

As the FAA falls under the jurisdiction of the federal government, I have respectfully asked our Congressional Representatives to help us protect our neighborhoods and work to address these issues.

Council also approved an ordinance that allows Transportation Network Companies like Uber and Lyft to operate legally in our community effective March 1, 2015. This ordinance will be reviewed by the Public Safety Committee in 6 months and then full Council in a year.

Our office will be closed December 22-January 2nd, but please reach out to me if you should have any comments or concerns in District 10.
