Event entrance is from Marshall St only. Do not enter through McDonalds' driveway. The event is FREE if membership dues are paid (check or paypal) received by Thurs. June 12th. *** \$35 for those who pay the day of the event *** Cash or Check Only – No credit cards accepted.

The Event is open to Columbine West residents only. Participants must have a picture ID with valid Columbine West address or proof of address from a current Xcel bill. Food donations of canned goods and non-perishables will benefit the Open Arms Food Bank which serves the Columbine area, so please be as generous as possible.

**Recycling areas in the order they will be set up are:

- <u>Document Shredding</u> All your important personal documents shredded on-site as you watch if you request.
- Metal Recycling metal, aluminum, copper, cords/strings of lights, automobile batteries, lawn mowers, appliances such as refrigerators, dishwashers, washers/dryers, stoves, and microwaves, as well as barbeques, are all accepted items, and help pay for this event. Make sure gas and oil have been drained from lawn mowers and power tools prior to recycling.
- <u>Electronic Recycling</u> TV's, computer monitors, laptops, and hard drives, cell phones, and other electronics will be recycled in an environmentally green way.
- <u>Trash</u> anything you would normally take to the dump such as bushes, tree limbs, fencing, furniture, scrap lumber, and mattresses can be dropped off.

Why are residents being asked to "Purge the Spurge?" The Colorado Noxious Weed Act, §§ 35-5.5-101-119 C.R.S (2003) designates myrtle spurge as a Class A Noxious Weed that must be eradicated. It is a violation of this law to allow myrtle spurge to "produce seed or develop other reproductive propagules. Myrtle Spurge is an ornamental that some people once planted in their yards. It is a perennial that produces new stems from the taproot each year. The plants are 4 to 6 inches tall, have trailing stems, and fleshy, blue-green, triangle-shaped leaves. In the spring they produce clusters of small yellow flowers on top of each stem. Myrtle spurge is not only dangerous to native plants and wildlife; it is dangerous to you and your family. The most common victims of myrtle spurge are children who unassumingly pick the pretty flowers. Myrtle spurge produces a toxic, milky latex which causes severe blister-like burns if it touches your skin. If it gets in your eyes, seek medical attention! Suggested replacement plant is....the Chrome or Cushion Spurge is a popular perennial for spring display, especially nice to use alongside tulips and other spring-flowering bulbs. Outstanding for its display of bright golden-yellow flowers, over a perfect cushion of light green leaves. Excellent for edging, in the rock garden, or in containers. This cousin to the Myrtle Spruge does not have milky substance when picked or cut. This variety is also deer resistant.



One Minute Wellness... Sunshine

Colorado is one of the sunniest places on earth! With an average of 300 days of sunshine a year, it is wise to get savvy about sun and its effects. The skin uses sunlight to help manufacture vitamin D, which is important for normal bone formation. But ultraviolet light can be very detrimental.

Within the skin's epidermal (outer) layer are cells that contain the pigment melanin. Melanin protects skin from the sun's

ultraviolet rays, which can burn the skin, and over time, could reduce its elasticity and cause a person to age prematurely. Sun tans are produced because the exposure to sunlight causes the skin to produce more melanin and to darken. The tan fades as these cells move toward the surface and are sloughed off. Too much exposure to ultraviolet or UV rays can cause sunburn. UV rays penetrate the outer skin layers and pass into the deeper layers, where they can damage or kill skin cells.

Frequent and prolonged exposure to ultraviolet rays over many years is the chief cause of skin cancer. Examine skin regularly for development of suspicious growths or changes in an existing skin lesion. Early detection and treatment are key in increasing the cure rate for skin cancer.

Prolonged exposure to UV radiation damages the surface tissues of the eye as well as the retina and the lens. Yet while the Food and Drug Administration regulates sunglasses as medical devices, the agency does not stipulate that they must provide any particular level of UV protection. Therefore sunglasses in the store can range from protective to wholly ineffective. In


fact ineffective sun glasses give a false sense of protection thus allowing wearers to open their eyes more which increases susceptibility to harmful rays. So, look for labels and tags indicating that a pair of sunglasses provides at least "98 percent UV protection" or better yet that it "blocks 98 percent of UVA and UVB rays." If there is no label, or it says something vague like "UV absorbing" or "blocks most UV light," don't buy them, no matter how fashionable they are!

10 sun tips: 1) Wear good sunglasses 2) Wear sunscreen that is appropriate for the length of time you will be in the sun and remember to have special sunscreen for protection during water activities 3) Wear a hat and/scarf while hiking 4) Protect your eyes at all times...even in the car (even in the back seat) 5) If you think you will fall asleep in the sun, stay under an umbrella, awning, tree or other such cover

6) When going to high altitude additional protection is necessary 7) Take breaks from the sun if you are at an all day outing 8) Don't be fooled, when it is overcast the sun is still out! 9) If you start to feel faint, weak, nauseous, dizzy, get out of the sun! 10) Help others by reminding them to protect themselves too.

If the baby is uninjured, with pink skin or pin-feathers only, try to warm it by setting it on a closed container of warm water (keep the bird dry!), then place it back into the nest. Contrary to urban myth, birds will still care for their young after humans have touched them. If you find the same baby again, it is likely the parents have rejected it for other reasons and it is best to let nature take its course. If the nest has been blown down, you can put a substitute like a berry basket lined with soft material in its place and the parents may continue to care for it.

If the bird you found is almost fully feathered and hopping around, it's a fledgling. That means it's left the nest, but may not be ready to fly. This is an important part of the bird's natural development and they can survive without intervention. It is likely the parents are still nearby and will feed the baby when no one is around. Keep dogs, cats, and kids away from the area for a few days, and that baby should fly off!

If you find a bird (or other animal) with an obvious injury, or a fledgling abandoned for a full day, you might choose to intervene. Keep yourself and your family safe by using precautions against disease transfer or injuries by wearing gloves, using carriers with secure closures, and washing all clothing, hands, and implements used. Do not try to feed or force water on a captive animal. Baby birds can be injured by tweezers or forceps used because of the way they feed. It is best to not


try to raise them yourself, no matter how much your kids beg you! It requires special training, a permit from the state, and feeding almost every hour around the clock! Take the animal to a licensed rehabilitator like wildbirdrehab.com. If you do, consider offering help with transportation or expenses as these places are usually non-profits with limited funding. As much as we love wildlife, South Platte Park is not licensed or equipped for them, but we're happy to try to help find someone who can. You're not the only person who needs a daily dose of caffeine in some form. A study by the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention reports that 73 percent of young people (up to age 22) consume caffeine on an average day, a figure that's stayed steady over the decade from 1999 to 2010.

And it's not just from soda. In fact, caffeine from soda consumption has dropped in the last 10 years, from 62 percent to 38 percent. Kids nowadays are drinking more coffee than before, an increase from 10 percent in 1999 to 24 percent in 2010. They're also getting caffeine from sweetened tea drinks and other beverages, including energy drinks. Although statistics for energy drinks weren't available from the early years of the study, by 2010 they represented 6 percent of the caffeine intake of the children studied.
