

From its humble beginnings as a Salvation Army captain's startup program in 1891 in San Francisco, the Red Kettle





Campaign has grown into one of the most recognizable and important charitable campaigns in the United States. It provides toys for kids, coats for the homeless, food for the hungry and countless social service programs year-round. As part of the campaign, more than 25,000 Salvation Army volunteers throughout the country ring bells and solicit donations to the red kettles. The red kettle has a long standing tradition during the holiday season. Everywhere, public contributions to Salvation Army kettles enable the organization to continue its year-round efforts at helping those who would otherwise be forgotten. All of the money donated in the Kettle stays in our local community, it funds Salvation Army charities all year, not just at Christmas time.

Columbine Kiwanis needs your help as bell ringers. What does a bell ringer do? They do not ask people for money. They are not to be aggressive or impede traffic. They just ring the bell and say thank you if someone gives to the kettle. Most often you will receive a warm smile, thank you and a genuine Merry Christmas salutation. We will be ringing at 3 stores for 2 weeks. We plan to ring (85) 2 hour shifts, last year we raised over \$20,000. In the 25+ years we have been ringing we have raised over \$270,000. We provide a turnkey collection service. We ring the bells, collect and count the money, and prepare bank deposit slips. We bring the bank deposit slips and money to the Salvation Army every day.

Dear Foothills District Residents and Patrons,

I am disappointed to share with you that the mill levy increase was voted down by District resident voters. The unofficial vote count resulted in 20,023 in favor, 23,602 opposed. As a governmental entity, we are required to provide a balanced budget and the District will continue to provide services as operational funds are available. However, since staff and the Board of Directors have already reviewed and reduced services to be able to balance budgets in recent years, services will more than likely need to be further reduced to balance future budgets. This will likely have a negative effect on parks, facilities and services.

If the mill levy had passed, the District would have used the additional taxes to: provide better park maintenance, improve conditions of parks and sports fields, improve neighborhood and community parks, renovate Clement Park, improve outdated and failing equipment, enhance trails for better connectivity, repair buildings and pools and offset the overall increasing operational and maintenance costs. Unfortunately, what this failure means to you as a community member living in the District and/or as a patron of our parks and facilities is that we will not be able to make improvements in these areas. The community will continue to experience deteriorating parks and infrastructure and because these projects are deferred, they will cost more in the future.

If you supported the mill levy, we would like to thank you, as you shared the vision of a better community. If you did not support the mill levy or would like to share any feedback, we welcome hearing from you.

### Behind the Badge: Winter Driving

Winter in Colorado is anything but predictable. Driving conditions can change quickly from dry and clear to icy and snow-packed. A short drive across town can challenge a motorist with a variety of diverse driving conditions. Even a seasoned driver can benefit from winter driving tips. It is important for motorists to be prepared and alert at all times while driving.

Vehicles should be inspected to ensure they are roadworthy for adverse conditions. Maintaining wiper fluid, inspecting tire tread, and installing snow tires are all recommendations for driving in adverse conditions. Motorists should also consider checking weather and road conditions before venturing out. Doing so allows for the opportunity to adjust routes to avoid dangerous hills, bridges, or corners prone to ice.

From a law enforcement perspective, it is incredibly valuable for motorists to let someone know your destination, route, and expected time of arrival. With a route identified, law enforcement can narrow their search area should the need arise.

The Jefferson County Sheriff's Office recommends placing several items in your vehicle in preparation of adverse weather. Below is a useful checklist to start your kit:

- Flashlight w/ extra batteries
- Flares or reflective triangles
- · Jumper cables
- Cell phone and an external charging device
- General first-aid kit
- Rags or paper towels
- Gallon of water
- Non-perishable food

- Blanket
- Basic tool kit
- · Extra set of clothes
- Winter formula window washer fluid
- Non-clumping kitty litter/sand
- Ice-scraper, snow brush, shovel
- Tire chains
- Extra car fuses
